PROCEDURAL ORDER

An Application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility was filed in the above captioned matter with Docket Control of the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") on November 23, 2009. A copy of the Application was transmitted to John Foreman, designee of the Attorney General of Arizona, Terry Goddard, as Chairman ("Chairman") and Presiding Officer of the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee ("Committee"). A.R.S. §§ 40-360.01(B) (1) and 40-360.03. A hearing/meeting of the Committee was held on January 12 and 13, 2010. After the hearing, the Applicant has filed an Application for Ratification and Reconsideration of Intervention Request. The Application for Ratification and Reconsideration of Intervention Request first asks for ratification of the action of the Committee in granting the CEC on January 13, 2010, because the Chairman erroneously advised the public at the beginning of the hearing that "[r]ecording is inappropriate." (Reporter's Transcript, page 5, line 12). A.R.S. § 38-431.01(F) allows recordation of a public meeting of a public body unless it interferes with the meeting. This error was not called to the attention of the Chairman at the time it was made or at any other point in the meeting so it could be corrected.

The Chairman had previously ordered that expedited transcripts be prepared and filed with the Commission and provided to two local libraries within three days after the hearing. See Pre-Hearing Procedural Order of November 25, 2009. No allegation of

prejudice by any person is contained in the record. After consultation with a member of the Open Meeting Law Enforcement Team of the Arizona Attorney General's Office, it appears the inadvertent erroneous statement of the Chairman may be technical and not require ratification. See *Karol v. Bd. Of Education Trustees*, 122 Ariz. 95, 593 P.2d 649 (1979); *Ahnert v. Sunnyside Unified School District #12*, 126 Ariz. 473, 616 p.2d 933 (App. 1980). However, the Applicant should not be placed in the position of having to assume the risk that a reviewing court would agree, and the request for ratification appears to be a reasonable option for the Committee to consider.

However, granting the second request made by the Applicant would make moot the ratification request. If the Committee allowed the two individuals who asked to intervene in the hearing to now intervene, as requested by the Applicant, it would reopen the evidentiary portion of the hearing so the new interveners could cross-examine all the witnesses who have already testified, and call the witnesses they wish to call. This would presumably require at least one more day of evidentiary hearing and perhaps significantly more. It is unclear whether the resumed evidentiary hearing should be held in Kingman. The Committee is the decision maker for intervention requests and, therefore, is the decision maker for any request to reconsider an earlier decision concerning intervention.

The record does raise two similar issues of waiver that the Committee must address before or as it considers the merits of the reconsideration request. At the time the Committee made its decision on the requests to intervene, the following exchange took place between the Chairman and counsel for the Applicant:

[Chairman]:...Does the Applicant have a position to express with regard to either of the motions to appear as parties or with regard to the Chair's offer to allow these folks to testify as witnesses later?

MR. CAMPBELL: Your Honor, we don't have any objection to the Committee calling Mr. Torres' client or Ms. Bensusan or Ms. Bayer so they can lay out their position for you. (*Reporter's Transcript, page 13, II. 3-10*)

The Application for Ratification and Reconsideration of Intervention Request does not contain any citation to any other request by counsel for the Applicant to reconsider the decision not to allow intervention during the hearing. So the Committee must decide whether the Applicant waived the right to later ask for reconsideration, because it affirmatively did not object at the time the decision was made so the Committee could correct its decision. And, the Committee must decide the related issue: whether to allow an Applicant to reopen the hearing when no newly discovered evidence, mistake or unforeseen circumstance has occurred after the presentation of evidence is complete, the Committee has concluded its deliberations and the Committee has voted on a final CEC.

As authorized by A.R.S. §§ 40-360.01(C) and (D), 40-360.04 and A.A.C. R14-3-201(E), the Chairman issues the following procedural order,

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

Pursuant to notice given as provided by law, the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee (the "Committee") held a public hearing on January 12 and January 13, 2010, in Kingman, Arizona, in conformance with the requirements of Arizona Revised Statutes ("A.R.S.") §§40-360, et seq., for the purpose of receiving evidence and deliberating on the Application of Hualapai Valley Solar LLC ("Applicant") for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility ("Certificate") in the above-captioned case (the "Project"). Further public meetings were held on post-hearing motions by the Applicant on January 27, 2010, in Goodyear, Arizona, and on February 11, 2010, at the State Capitol in Phoenix, Arizona.

The Applicant was represented by Thomas H. Campbell and Albert H. Acken, of the law firm of Lewis and Roca LLP.

At the conclusion of the hearings, the Committee, having received the Application, the appearances of the parties, the evidence, testimony and exhibits presented at the hearings, and being advised of the legal requirements of A.R.S. §§ 40-360 to 40-360.13, upon motion duly made and seconded, voted 10 to 0 to grant the Applicant this Certificate of Environmental Compatibility (Case No. 151) for the Project as set forth in the Application. At its meeting on January 27, 2010, the Committee, upon motion duly made and seconded, voted 10 to 0 to deny the Applicant's motion for the Committee to reconsider its decision not to allow the intervention as parties of two witnesses who testified at the January 12, and 13, 2010, hearing. At its meeting on February 11, 2010, the Committee, upon motion duly made and seconded, voted 9 to 0 to grant the Applicant's motion to ratify, and pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.05(B) ratified its decision granting this CEC.

 The Project consists of an up to 340 MW concentrated solar power ("CSP") or 500 MW photovoltaic ("PV") generating facility, with biofuel, light fuel oil or natural gas co-firing, and a 345kV or 500kV transmission line (the "Gen-Tie"). The Project is located in Mohave County, approximately 27 miles north of Kingman, Arizona, and 80 miles southeast of Las Vegas, Nevada. The generating facility is located entirely on private land in Sections 19, 20, 21, 28, 29, 30, and the north half of Section 31 all within Township 26 North, Range 16 West, Gila and Salt River Baseline and Meridian.

The Gen-Tie will interconnect the CSP generating facility (and/or a PV generating facility built on the site approved for the CSP generating facility) to the regional transmission grid using one of two approved alignments:

Interconnection #1 Gen-Tie alignment, located entirely in Township 26 North, Range 16 West, runs from the generating facility's power block to the property boundary; then north for 1.25 miles within a 1,320-foot wide corridor from the property boundary along the east boundary of Section 17 and Section 08; then north for 1.25 miles within a 1,320-foot wide corridor along the west boundary of Section 16 and Section 09 until it reaches the north boundary of Section 09; then east for about 0.75 miles within a 1,320-foot wide corridor along the north boundary of Section 09 until it reaches the termination in the northeast corner of Section 09. Interconnection #1 is approximately 2.75 miles in length from the generating facility property boundary.

Interconnection #2 Gen-Tie alignment runs from the generating facility's power block to the property boundary; then north for 1.25 miles within a 1,320-foot wide corridor from the property boundary along the east boundary of Section 17 and Section 08; then north for 1.25 miles within a 1,320-foot wide corridor along the west boundary of Section 16 and Section 09 until it reaches the north boundary of Section 09; then north for one mile within a 1,320-foot wide corridor through Section 04 until it reaches the west boundary of the existing Mead-Liberty 345kV transmission line corridor, which it will parallel on a generally northwest heading; from there it will run within a 2,640-foot wide corridor measured from the centerline of the Mead-Liberty

345kV transmission line west of and parallel to the existing transmission line for approximately 1 2 3.5 miles, going through the northeast corner of Section 05 in Township 26 North, Range 16 3 West; through Sections 32, 31, and 30 in Township 27 North, Range 16 West; through Sections 25 and 24 in Township 27 North, Range 17 West; and terminate in Section 23 in Township 27 4 North, Range 17 West. Interconnection #2 is approximately 6.5 miles in length from the property 5 6 boundary. The transmission structure heights will not exceed 199 feet and will occupy a right-of-way 7 8 width up to a maximum of 200 feet. 9 A general location map of the Project is set forth in Exhibit A. **CONDITIONS** 10 This Certificate is granted upon the following conditions: 11 The conditions shall apply to the Applicant, its successor(s), and assignee(s). 12 1. 2. The Applicant shall obtain all approvals and permits required by the United States, 13 the State of Arizona, the County of Mohave, and any other governmental entities having 14 jurisdiction necessary to construct the Project. 15 The Applicant shall comply with all existing applicable statutes, ordinances, master 3. 16 17 plans and regulations of the State of Arizona, the County of Mohave, the United States, and any other governmental entities having jurisdiction, including but not limited to the following: 18 all applicable land use regulations; a)

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all applicable zoning stipulations and conditions, including but not limited to (b)

landscaping and dust control requirements;

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all applicable water use, discharge and/or disposal requirements of the Arizona (c) Department of Water Resources and the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality;

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(d) all applicable noise control standards;

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all applicable regulations and permits governing storage and handling of chemicals (e) and petroleum products;

- (f) all other applicable federal and state regulations and standards.
- 4. The Applicant shall make all reasonable efforts to minimize the use of groundwater during construction and operation of the Project, and use effluent for cooling and all other non-potable water uses to the extent it is made available by the City of Kingman from its Hilltop Waste Water Treatment Plant ("WWTP") and can be transported by the Applicant and at the Applicant's expense to the Project site. The Applicant may utilize groundwater for potable uses and as a back-up to effluent when effluent is not available from the City of Kingman or when transmission of the effluent is interrupted from the Hilltop WWTP to the Project. Total water use per year shall not exceed 3,000 AF from all sources and shall not exceed 2,400 AF of groundwater for cooling purposes. The Applicant, within two years from the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") approval of the Certificate, shall contract with the City of Kingman for sale, transmission and use of effluent generated by the Hilltop WWTP. If contracting is unsuccessful in this time frame, the Applicant may apply to the Commission for an extension of time to negotiate the contract.
- 5. If any archaeological, paleontological or historical site or object that is at least fifty years old is discovered on state, county or municipal land during the construction or operation of the solar generating facility and transmission line, the Applicant or its representative in charge shall promptly report the discovery to the Director of the Arizona State Museum, and in consultation with the Director, shall immediately take all reasonable steps to secure and maintain the preservation of the discovery as required by A.R.S. § 41-844.
- 6. If human remains and/or funerary objects are encountered on private land during the course of any ground-disturbing activities relating to the construction or operation of the solar generating facility and transmission line, the Applicant shall cease work on the affected area of the Project and notify the Director of the Arizona State Museum as required by A.R.S. § 41-865.
- 7. The Applicant shall comply with the notice and salvage requirements of the Arizona Native Plant Law (A.R.S. §§ 3-901, et seq.) and shall, to the extent feasible, minimize the

destruction of native plants during the construction and operation of the solar generating facility and transmission line.

- 8. This authorization to construct this Project (which may be constructed in two phases) shall expire unless the solar generating facility and transmission line are capable of operation within seven years from the date the Certificate is approved by the Commission. However, prior to expiration, the Applicant may request that the Commission extend this time limitation.
- 9. In the event that the Project requires an extension of the term of this Certificate prior to completion of construction, Applicant shall use reasonable means to notify all landowners and residents within one mile of the Project corridor as depicted on Exhibit A, all persons who made public comment at this proceeding, and all parties to this proceeding of the request and the date, time and place of the hearing in which the Commission will consider the request for extension.
- 10. The Applicant shall make every reasonable effort to identify and correct, on a case-specific basis, all complaints of interference with radio or television signals from operation of the transmission lines and related facilities addressed in this Certificate. The Applicant shall maintain written records for a period of five years of all complaints of radio or television interference attributable to operation, together with the corrective action taken in response to each complaint. All complaints shall be recorded to include notations on the corrective action taken. Complaints not leading to a specific action or for which there was no resolution shall be noted and explained. Upon request, the written records shall be provided to the Staff of the Commission.
- 11. Within 120 days of the Commission decision granting this Certificate, Applicant will post a sign at the plant site. The sign shall be no smaller than a normal roadway sign and shall advise:
 - (a) That the site has been approved for the construction of Project facilities;
 - (b) The expected date of completion of the Project facilities;

- (c) A phone number for public information regarding the Project;
- (d) The name of the Project;
- (e) The name of the Applicant; and
- (f) The website of the Project.
- 12. Applicant shall design the transmission line to incorporate reasonable measures to minimize impacts to raptors.
- 13. Applicant shall use non-specular conductor and non-reflective surfaces for transmission line structures.
- 14. Before construction on this Project may commence, the Applicant shall file a construction mitigation and restoration plan ("Plan") with ACC Docket Control. Where practicable, the Plan shall specify the Applicant's plans for construction access and methods to minimize impacts to wildlife and to minimize vegetation disturbance outside of the Project right-of-way particularly in drainage channels and along stream banks. Applicant shall re-vegetate, unless waived by the landowner, native areas of construction disturbance to its preconstruction state outside of the power-line right of way after construction has been completed. The Plan shall specify the Applicant's plans for coordination with the Arizona Game and Fish Department and the State Historic Preservation Office. The Applicant shall use existing roads for construction and access where practicable and the Plan shall specify the manner in which the applicant makes use of existing roads.
- 15. Applicant shall follow any published guidelines adopted by the Arizona Game and Fish Department of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service for handling contacts during the construction and operation of the Project with any species designated as endangered. Applicant also shall follow any published and adopted guidelines for handling contacts with any species of greatest conservation need as designated by the Arizona Game and Fish Department. If no published and adopted guidelines exist, the Applicant shall use reasonable care to avoid any harm to individuals of the designated species. If the avoidance of harm to individuals is not possible,

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the Applicant shall contact the Arizona Game and Fish Department and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service to obtain any appropriate permits and guidance for removing from the area of the Project the individual members of the species contacted.

- 16. All lighting shall be shielded, cantered or cut to ensure that light reaches only areas needing illumination.
- 17. With respect to the Project, Applicant shall participate in good faith in state and regional transmission study forums to coordinate transmission expansion plans related to the Project and to resolve transmission constraints in a timely manner.
- 18. The Applicant shall provide copies of this Certificate to the Mohave County Planning Department, the City of Kingman, the Arizona State Land Department, the State Historic Preservation Office, and the Arizona Game and Fish Department.
- 19. Prior to the date construction commences on this Project, the Applicant shall provide known homebuilders and developers within one mile of the center line of the Certificated route and solar facility, the identity, location, and a pictorial depiction of the type of power line and solar facility being constructed, accompanied by a written description, and encourage the developers and homebuilders to include this information in the developers' and homebuilders' homeowners' disclosure statements.
- 20. Applicant will follow the most current Western Electricity Coordinating Council/North American Electric Reliability Corporation planning standards as approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, and National Electrical Safety Code construction standards.
- 21. The Applicant shall submit a self-certification letter annually, identifying progress made with respect to each condition contained in the Certificate, including which conditions have been met. The letter shall be submitted to the Docket Control of the Commission by December 1, 2010, and annually thereafter. Attached to each certification letter shall be documentation explaining how compliance with each condition was achieved. Copies of each letter along with

the corresponding documentation shall be submitted to the Arizona Attorney General and Department of Commerce Energy Office. The requirement for the self-certification shall expire on the date the Project is placed into operation.

- 22. The Applicant also shall file quarterly reports with Docket Control and the Compliance Officer of the Commission listing: (1) the number of legal residents at the time of hiring from Mohave County hired for construction jobs on this Project; and (2) the number of legal residents at the time of hiring from Arizona outside Mohave County hired for construction jobs on this Project. Reports shall commence December 1, 2010, and continue until commencement of commercial operation of the Project.
- 23. The Applicant also shall file quarterly reports with Docket Control and the Compliance Officer of the Commission listing businesses in Mohave County and the remainder of Arizona with whom the Applicant has substantial contracts to provide goods and services during construction of the Project and the effluent pipeline. The reports shall include the total dollar amount going to Mohave County and total dollar amount going to Arizona outside of Mohave County. Reports shall commence December 1, 2010, and continue until commencement of commercial operation of the Project.
- 24. The Applicant also shall file annual reports with Docket Control and the Compliance Officer of the Commission, and with the Arizona Department of Water Resources stating the total amount of water used in the operation of the Project, including the amount of groundwater. Annual reports of water usage shall begin with commencement of commercial operation of the Project and continue for the life of the Project.
- 25. Within sixty (60) days of the Commission decision granting this Certificate, the Applicant shall make good faith efforts to commence discussions with private landowners, on whose property the Project corridor is located, to identify the specific location for the Project right-of-way and placement of poles.
 - The Applicant shall expeditiously pursue reasonable efforts to work with private

1	landowners on whose property the Project right-of-way will be located, to mitigate the impacts of		
2	the location, construction, and operation of the Project on private land.		
3	27. Applicant shall make good faith efforts to continue to partner with Mohave County		
4	workforce development personnel on job training and/or apprenticeship programs for Mohave		
5	County residents and to encourage its contractors to utilize qualified local construction workers to		
6	construct the Project.		
7	28. Within ninety (90) days of the Commission decision granting this Certificate, the		
8	Applicant shall make good faith efforts to commence discussions with the Arizona Building		
9	Trades Council on a model construction agreement to encourage the utilization of qualified local		
10	or Arizona union or non-union construction workers for the construction of the Project.		
11	FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW		
12	This Certificate incorporates the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:		
13	1. The Project aids the Southwest region in meeting the need for an adequate,		
14	economical and reliable supply of renewable electric power.		
15	2. The conditions placed on the Project in the Certificate by the Committee effectively		
16	minimize the impact of the Project on the environment and ecology of the state.		
17	3. The Project is in the public interest because the Project's contribution to meeting		
18	the need for an adequate, economical and reliable supply of renewable electric power outweighs		
19	the minimized impact of the Project on the environment and ecology of the state.
