All,
We have just received some disturbing and distressing information concerning the power issue (referenced above docket number) in the Whetstone, Sonoita, Elgin, Canelo, etc areas. I would first like to say that as current property owners and future home owners in the Elgin area-where our land is located, we are extremely dismayed and very concerned over this entire situation: We heard about this from another interested party such as ourselves, we knew nothing of this entire situation until a few days ago, we are very disappointed that Santa Cruz county did not bother to inform us of this situation that could / would directly impact our ability to build our home in Elgin.

If this moratorium is passed we would not be able to build our home in Elgin, which in turn would cause our future plans of building our dream home in Elgin would be destroyed. The investment we have made for our future would be worthless. My next option would be to seek legal advice on the culpability of Santa Cruz county and SSVEC. Who would pay for the investment we have since it would be essentially worthless to anyone who would want to build anything on the fourteen acres we own?! I am quite sure there are other land and future home owners who would be in the same predicament as us, not to mention the instability of the current power for those who are already living in the affected areas and dealing with the "brown outs" as they are named in the docket.

I urge the commission to reconsider the previous vote, search for options to the electricity problems, provide alternatives, and pose the options to the land owners, home owners, and business owners both current and future in the affected areas.

A reasonable solution that accomodates all the parties concerned-not just a small group who are opposed to the new power station, must be made that is within reason. I would appreciate notification of the next meeting date, time and place so that my husband and I can make every effort to attend. The current supposed solution is not acceptable and is highly unreasonable. Please vote for the ability to either build the new substation or ensure that those of us who are current land and future home and business owners are allowed to have the electricity we require for our homes, future homes, businesses and future businesses.
