Re: APS rate case - Docket Number E-01345A-08-0172

I am writing to express support for the proposed settlement for the APS rate case. The energy efficiency and renewable energy provisions will help reduce pollution and water use, plus help people and businesses lower electric bills, even with increased rates.

This proposed settlement for the rate case will result in energy efficiency savings that represent 3.75% of the APS retail load by the end of 2012. By increasing energy efficiency and reducing energy consumption, customers can reduce their energy bills by 10-50%, even if the cost of the customer programs increases electric rates by 1-2%.

I am supportive of the program to invest in efficiency and renewable energy for K-12 schools. Eliminating the upfront costs for schools will remove a significant barrier for schools investing in renewable energy, and the energy efficiency investments will help schools lower their electric bills.

Programs that provide rebates and technical assistance to electric utility customers who purchase energy efficient lighting, air conditioners, and other equipment or invest in measures in their home, office, or other buildings that result in reductions in energy use are all good investments for the future and are necessary for reducing our energy load in Arizona.

I oppose efforts by some realtors and developers to reinstate a subsidy for urban sprawl that the Commission eliminated back in 2007.

Ratepayers should not have to provide free line extensions far from existing development.

Thank you for your leadership on energy efficiency and renewables and for considering my comments as you make your decision about whether or not to adopt this settlement.
