IN OPPOSITION

Subject: HVS has proposed 2270 acre-feet of water or 739,793,000 gallons of total water from Kingman's aquifer per year.

We respectively have a request for you to confirm or deny the following facts that have been stated at the Line Siting Committee meetings held at the Hampton Inn, 1791 Sycamore Avenue, Kingman on January 12, 13, and 14, 2010.

That the amount of effluent/waste water that Mayor Salem said that Kingman could sell is 1700 acre-feet per year or 554,030,000 gallons of effluent water versus what the Superintendent of the Waste Water Plant said that the Kingman Waste Water Plant could provide, if at full capacity, is 1,000,000 gallons per day or 365,000,000 gallons per year of effluent water. Subtract the 365,000,000 gallons of effluent water from the 554,030,000 gallons of effluent water and it leaves a shortage of 189,030,000 gallons of water to be provided by other means. **What are the other means?**

To take the effluent water from the Kingman area would create a shortage of water which could be used for our parks, golf course, **and most important of all to replenish our aquifer.**

The Citizens to Preserve Kingman's Aquifers believes that given the information submitted by HVS Managing Director Greg Bartlett and Environmental Director Mike La-Row to secure initial approvals from Mohave County and recommended Arizona Corporation Commission approval for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility should be either rejected or put on hold for further analysis by qualified individuals.
