PROCEDURAL ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

By Procedural Order dated May 8, 2002, the Hearing Division of the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") set a schedule in the above-captioned matter. Under this schedule Qwest would submit the agreements for the record, interested parties would have until May 20, 2002 to file comments, Qwest would file reply comments on May 27, 2002, and Staff would file a report with recommendations to the Commission on June 3, 2002.

On May 10, 2002, Qwest filed the agreements as required under the Procedural Order.

On May 15, 2002, AT&T of the Mountain States, Inc. and TCG Phoenix (collectively "AT&T") filed a Motion to Extend the Procedural Schedule. AT&T requested until May 28, 2002, to file its Comments because the schedules in the Section 271 and CPNI dockets required its counsel to attend two Commission Special Open Meetings, a workshop and to file testimony and comments between May 13, and May 17, 2002, thus preventing counsel from having adequate time to review the documents and draft meaningful comments in this proceeding.

On May 16, 2002, Qwest opposed AT&T's request on the grounds that it would unduly delay the proceeding. Qwest believed that AT&T's counsel had sufficient knowledge of the issues from the company's experience in other jurisdictions to be able to file comments in Arizona on May 20, 2002.

On May 16, 1992, the Residential Utility Consumers Office ("RUCO") filed a Response to AT&T's Motion and joined in AT&T's request because it too required additional time to review and

1 analyze the voluminous documents filed in this matter.


2 The Commission is aware of the relationship of this matter with the Section 271 proceeding
3 and desires to proceed in the current docket expeditiously. However, AT&T's and RUCO's requests
4 are not unreasonable under the circumstances. The Commission's investigation of this matter will
5 benefit from the thorough analysis and comments of interested parties. A short extension will not
6 prejudice Qwest.

7 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the schedule set in the May 8, 2002, Procedural Order
8 shall be modified as follows:

- 9 May 24, 2002 Interested Parties file Comments on Qwest's submissions
- 10 May 31, 2002 Qwest Reply to the Parties' Comments
- 11 June 7, 2002 Staff Report and Recommendations to the Commission

12 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Presiding Officer may rescind, alter, amend, or waive
13 any portion of this Procedural Order either by subsequent Procedural Order or by ruling at hearing.
