My name is Bob Misiorowski. I am a movie producer and one of my films, **TOMBSTONE**, was largely filmed on location at the Babacomari Ranch in Elgin, Arizona.

I would like to express my heartfelt displeasure with the 69kV high tension power line that the SSVEC Utility is proposing to put through that scenic area... a proposal that, I believe, seriously threatens any potential

filmmaking activities in this area.

I was, in fact, recently scouting the Babacomari location with an eye toward shooting another film in the area but, if this line goes in, I don't see how that will be possible.

Lest I be accused of being a carpetbagger, I would like you to know that I am nearing completion on a home I am building in Patagonia. And, while it is hard to ignore the problems facing a small town in a relatively remote region of the state, the facts - as I have researched them - do not seem to warrant the SSVEC's insistence on putting the proposed power line through the area when there seem to be alternatives that could satisfy the power needs of this entire region. As I read it, the Feasibility Study confirms the lack of any immediate need for such a line.

To a newcomer, it seems that the literature that the SSVEC is broadcasting twists the findings of the Feasibility Study to support their insistence that this line is the only available option for the region.

I urge you to continue a policy of careful and thoughtful oversight of this utility. I urge you to solicit measured cooperation with the people of all of the communities involved. I urge you to closely monitor any and all proposals for future power designs. And, finally, I urge you to call for transparency in all of the dealings of the utility so that any claims of wrongdoing are not the subject of rumors and innuendos, but that the citizens be presented with facts upon which they can make a considered opinion and voice their concerns to a commission that cares.
