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
1 The only party to address issues raised by ASBA/AASBO in the initial briefs was  
2 the Applicant, UNS Electric. In its brief, UNS Electric states that it will continue to work  
3 with schools to: (1) develop a school-specific renewable program for its next renewable  
4 energy implementation plan; (2) develop a school-specific energy efficiency plan; and (3)  
5 discuss a school-specific TOU tariff that could be included in UNS Electric's next rate  
6 case.

8 ASBA/AASBO support the development of a school-specific renewable program  
9 for inclusion in the company's next renewable energy implementation plan and request  
10 that the Commission direct UNS Electric to do so. With respect to an energy efficiency  
11 plan, ASBA/AASBO request that the Commission require UNS Electric to file a school-  
12 specific program for energy efficiency in the DSM docket within three months from the  
13 issuance of the Commission's order in this case. Finally, ASBA/AASBO request that the  
14 Commission direct UNS Electric to develop and file with the Commission an optional  
15 rate for schools within its service territory. In their initial brief, ASBA/AASBO  
16 requested that such a filing be made within 90 days following the filing of the APS  
17 optional school rate. The APS optional rate was filed for approval on March 31, 2010.  
18 As a result, UNS Electric should be directed to file a similar rate for approval within 90  
19 days of the Commission's order in this case.
