Dear Sir or Madam:

On December 15, 2009, Broadview Networks, Inc. ("Broadview") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission an Application and Petition For Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Provide Resold Local Exchange Telecommunications Services in Arizona.

In response to A-18 of that Application, "States in which the Applicant has had an application approved or denied to offer telecommunications services similar to those that the Applicant will or intends to offer in Arizona", Broadview advised the Commission that

"Broadview Networks, Inc., is presently authorized by the Federal Communications Commission to provide interstate domestic and international telecommunications services pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. Broadview is also certified, registered or otherwise authorized to provide interexchange long distance telecommunications services throughout the contiguous United States. In Arizona, Broadview has been granted a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Provide Resold Long Distance Telecommunications Services in Docket T-20565A-07-0651, Decision No. 71295 (October 7, 2009).

Additionally, Broadview has authority to provide local exchange telecommunications services in California, Connecticut, the District of Columbia, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia and Washington."

Subsequent to the filing of the Application in December, 2009, Broadview has received additional grants of authority to provide local exchange telecommunications services. Accordingly, by this submission, Broadview wishes to update its response to Application Item A-18 to the Application, to reflect the following additional grants of authority to provide local exchange services.

As of the date of this letter, Broadview is additionally authorized to provide local exchange services in the States of Alabama, Colorado, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, South Dakota, West Virginia, Wisconsin and Wyoming.

This brings the number of jurisdictions in which Broadview is authorized to provide local exchange services to 45. Additionally, Broadview has applications for local exchange telecommunications service authority pending in the States of Arizona, Arkansas, Louisiana and Oklahoma.
