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PROCEDURAL ORDER

**BY THE COMMISSION:**

On January 15, 2002, the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") issued Decision No. 64357 which granted Duke Energy Arlington Valley, LLC ("Duke Energy") a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility ("CEC").


On February 14, 2002, the Commission issued Decision No. 64495, which amended Decision No. 64357. Decision No. 64717 (April 12, 2002) amended Decision No. 64495, and restated the conditions under which the CEC was issued.

On June 30, 2002, Duke Energy filed a Request for Extension ("Request") to Decision No. 64717 until October 31, 2002 to convene an Arizona gas workshop. Condition #15 of the CEC requires Duke Energy to convene a workshop in early 2002 to address gas transportation reliability and capacity issues. In consultation with the Commission's Utilities Division Staff ("Staff"), Duke Energy prepared a proposed agenda and participant list for the gas workshop, which was attached to the Request. According to the Request, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") is conducting proceedings regarding gas transportation issues, and Staff and Duke Energy agree that convening a workshop in the Fall of 2002 would be more valuable because FERC may issue decisions and regulations concerning gas transportation issues that should be taken into account in the Arizona gas workshop.

1 On July 3, 2002, Staff filed its Response to the Request stating it had no objections to the  
2 extension. Accordingly, for good cause shown, Duke Energy's Request should be granted.

3 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Duke Energy is hereby granted an extension until  
4 October 31, 2002 to convene the gas transportation workshop.


