At the hearing for the proposed West Valley Transmission Line, you inquired whether or not Maricopa County has plans in the immediate future to widen Indian School Road between Citrus and Perryville Roads, and if so, would those county plans impact the row of eucalyptus trees paralleling the north side of the road. I agreed to look into the matter.

The answer is that the county does not have any immediate plans to fund the widening of this stretch of Indian School Road, based on my research. Such plans are not listed in the county's Transportation Improvement Projects Book for fiscal years 2004 to 2008, which can be found at <http://www.mcdot.maricopa.gov/tip/home.htm>. My contact at Maricopa County Department of Transportation confirmed that such plans do not exist (see attached email correspondence).

It has been suggested to us that the county plans to widen this road in the near future. I am asking because a row of 80-foot-tall eucalyptus trees occurs along the north side of Indian School Road. Based on recent research, they were planted by local farmers as windbreaks in the early 1940s. We are currently evaluating them as a vernacular rural landscape as part of a compliance review involving another state agency (Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee). We trying to convince them to avoid the tree row. However, it would be silly to have one agency avoid a possible historic property when another governmental entity may be planning to negatively impact it anyway.--Sincerely,Matthew H.
