**FOURTH**  
**PROCEDURAL ORDER**

**BY THE COMMISSION:**

On September 7, 2000, the Securities Division ("Division") of the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") filed a Temporary Order to Cease and Desist ("T.O.") and a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing ("Notice") against Global Harvest Corp. ("GHC") David Patten and Albert Tabah, (collectively the "Respondents") in which the Division alleged multiple violations of the Arizona Securities Act ("Act") in connection with the offer and sale of securities in the form of investment contracts or commodity investment contracts. As a result of the T.O., the Respondents were immediately ordered to cease and desist from violating the Securities Act of Arizona.

The Respondents were all duly served with copies of the Notice.

On September 26, 2000, Respondents GHC, Mr. Patten and Mr. Tabah filed a request for hearing.

On October 2, 2000, by Procedural Order, a pre-hearing was scheduled for October 11, 2000, but the Procedural Order mailed to Respondents' counsel was returned undelivered and the proceeding was rescheduled for October 17, 2000.

1 On October 17, 2000, the pre-hearing conference was held to address the issues raised in the T.O., the  
2 Notice, and the presentation of evidence. Counsel for the Respondents and the Division were present  
3 and advised the presiding Administrative Law Judge that the Respondents had initiated an action in  
4 the United States District Court for the District of Arizona for injunctive relief against the  
5 Commission's action herein and that oral arguments are scheduled for October 25, 2000 on  
6 Respondents' request for a preliminary injunction. The Division has filed a Motion to Dismiss the  
7 Respondents' court action, and is awaiting a ruling on its motion at this time.

8 On October 17, 2000, by Procedural Order, a pre-hearing conference was scheduled for  
9 November 9, 2000. A hearing was scheduled for November 15 and 16, 2000.

10 On October 24, 2000, the Division filed a Notice of District Court Ruling and requested a  
11 change in hearing dates from November 15 and 16, 2000 to November 16 and 17, 2000. Counsel for  
12 Respondents agreed telephonically.

13 Accordingly, an additional pre-hearing conference should be held to address the status of  
14 these proceedings prior to the commencement of a hearing on the date agreed upon.

15 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that a pre-hearing conference shall be held on November 9,  
16 2000, at 9:30 a.m., at the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona.

17 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that counsel for the parties shall also reserve November 16 and  
18 November 17, 2000, at 9:30 a.m., for purposes of hearing.


