THIRD PROCEDURAL ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On August 14, 2001, the Securities Division ("Division") of the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") filed a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing Regarding Proposed Order to Cease and Desist, for Restitution, for Administrative Penalties, and for Other Affirmative Action ("Notice") against David Nutter and North American Insurance Services L.L.C. (collectively the "Respondents") in which the Division alleged that Respondents have engaged in acts, practices, and transactions that constitute violations of the Arizona Securities Act ("Act").

Respondents were duly served with copies of the Notice.

On August 22, 2001, Respondents filed a request for a hearing.

On August 29, 2001, the Commission issued a Procedural Order that set this matter for a pre-hearing on September 17, 2001.

On September 17, 2001, the pre-hearing was held as scheduled. Respondents appeared with

1 the assistance of counsel. The Division also appeared with counsel. Following discussions between
2 the parties, it was agreed that a hearing should be scheduled on the issues raised in the Notice. In the
3 interim, the parties agreed to attempt to resolve the issues raised in the Notice.

4 On September 18, 2001, the Commission issued a Procedural Order that set this matter for a
5 hearing on January 16, 2002.


6 On January 14, 2002, the parties filed a Joint Motion to Continue. In the Motion, the parties
7 indicate that they need more time to complete the negotiations to resolve this matter.

9 The Commission finds that a continuance is in the interests of justice; that it is not intended to
10 delay the proceedings; that all parties have agreed to the continuance; and that all applicable time
11 limits are waived in this matter. Accordingly, the hearing should be rescheduled.

12 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the hearing on the above-captioned matter set for
13 January 16, 2002 shall be vacated and the hearing is continued until March 13, 2002, at 1:00 p.m., at
14 the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona.

15 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties shall exchange witness lists and exhibits not
16 later than 10 days before the hearing and provide a copy of same to the presiding Administrative Law
17 Judge.


