WEBSITE COMPLIANCE MEMORANDUM ORDERED IN DOCKET NO.
E-01773A-09-0335 AND DECISION NO. 71451

In Decision No. 71451 ("Decision"), dated January 6, 2010, the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") approved the Renewable Energy Standard and Tariff ("REST") Implementation Plan for Arizona Electric Power Cooperative, Inc. ("AEP" or "Company").

As part of Decision No. 71451, the Commission ordered that AEP" participate (with other Commission regulated electric utilities) in the creation of a joint website titled "Go Solar Arizona" – whose purpose is to provide renewable energy information to the public (the website is now called Arizonagoessolar.org). At a minimum, the Decision required that certain general information be included in the website and also that certain specific information be included *and* updated at least twice monthly. This minimum information is shown below:

General

- Information regarding the availability of all residential solar incentives, including utility rebates offered through the REST and state and federal tax credits.
- Information about the Renewable Energy Standard ("RES").
- Information regarding the status of the Company in meeting the Standard.
- Information regarding the location of residential and commercial and utility scale systems statewide, and any "solar calculator" that is created by the Company.

Specific

- The reservation request review date.
- The incentive program under which the incentive is being offered.
- The amount of the incentive offered.
- The size and nature of the systems (whether commercial or residential).
- The step in the reservation process each system is in at the time it is posted.
- The total cost of the system.
- The nameplate rating of the system.

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- The current incentive application status.
- The name of the installer of the system.

Decision No. 71451 also provided that a compliance memorandum be filed by the Utilities Division Staff ("Staff") in the month of November each year beginning in 2010. The memorandum is required to state whether the Company has provided all the required information for the website and is therefore in compliance with the Decision. If the website is not in compliance, Staff shall list the reasons why.

Because AEPCO is not a distribution cooperative, it does not have information to report that corresponds to the categories of information listed in this letter. Staff believes that AEPCO is indirectly complying with the Decision through the action of the member distribution cooperatives which are the entities that are actually subject to the REST rules.

Staff has conducted its review of the Duncan Valley Electric Cooperative's and Graham County Electric Cooperative's portions of the website. The website includes the required information for both of the distribution Cooperatives with the exception of the following for Graham County Electric Cooperative:

- Information regarding the status of the Company in meeting the Standard.
