TEP's 138kV Transmission Line Project

My name is Mac Hudson, and I live in the Menlo Park Neighborhood. I support Citizens for Safe Powerlines and the Freeway route proposed by TEP. I'm very concerned about the possibility of being exposed to possible health risks from exposure to EMF radiation when there are good alternatives available. I also think 1001 tall poles would ruin the look of any residential neighborhood and don't belong next to homes. In addition:

- * I'm concerned about the effects of EMF exposure, and I don't think people should take the risk of living near transmissions lines when we there's evidence that EMF may cause leukemia and other medical conditions
- * I'm concerned that high voltage transmission lines will affect the value of my home
- * I don't think it's fair that our neighborhoods have to shoulder the burden of transmission lines that benefit the whole city
- * I think 100 foot poles are ugly and don't belong on residential streets and are better suited to the frontage road.
- * would like to see the pole at the corner of St. Mary's and the frontage road moved to the Southern side of the street away from Oury Park.
- * I'm concerned about the possibility of these power lines getting knocked down like the 46-ky line that was knocked down in 2007 along our streets.
- * It's not fair that Dunbar Spring and Barrio Anita already have the train, the new

Downtown Links freeway, an electrical substation, and now they're being asked to support even more infrastructure with these transmissions lines.

* Dunbar Spring is a Nationally designated historic neighborhood and these poles don't belong here where they'll erode the historic integrity of the neighborhood.

I also wanted to say that I think TEP should build a wall around the substation instead of just having a chain link fence and I'd like to see them remove the 75' poles on 11th avenue when they relocate the 46-ky line. Thank you.
