Response: Telesphere Access, LLC's Officers' Biographical Information

Clark Peterson - Chief Executive Officer

With over twenty years of experience in the telecommunications industry, Clark Peterson brings extensive leadership and insight to his role as Chief Executive Officer of Telesphere Networks and Telesphere Access. His experience, spanning both the wireline and wireless industries, has been with some of the most respected names in the telecommunications industry. Most recently Mr. Peterson served as the President of U.S. Major Market Operations for Clearwire. As one of the original employees of Clearwire, Mr. Peterson was a key part of building Clearwire's foundation and successfully executing its business plan. Under a strong management team the company grew to over 800 employees, 88,000 customers and raised over 2 billion dollars in funding during his tenure there. Before that, Mr. Peterson was President of the West Region for XO Communications, the nation's largest competitive local exchange carrier. While overseeing XO's largest region, he was responsible for the management of over 260 employees spread over several markets, including the major markets of Los Angeles and San Francisco. He also performed several other roles with XO, including serving as the General Manager for NEXTLINK and building the Las Vegas market from inception. Response: Telesphere Networks Ltd. ("Telesphere Networks") is the parent company of Telesphere. Telesphere Networks was formed in 2000 as a wireless ISP, primarily serving business customers. In 2003-2004, Telesphere Networks also began to offer interconnected VoIP and wireline broadband internet services to its business customers. In 2006 Telesphere Networks began to wind down its wireless business in order to focus on interconnected VoIP and wireline broadband internet. The wind down of the wireless business was substantially completed in 2007. Telesphere Networks formed Telesphere Access, LLC in 2009 in order to obtain a CLEC license to better serve its business customers.





I am counsel to Telesphere Access, LLC and on behalf of my client, I provide the following responses to the Commission's Fourth Set of Data Requests in Docket No. T-20675A-09-0214.

STF 4.1 The applicant, Telesphere Access, LLC ("Applicant") does not provide any telephone numbers to customers in Arizona. Neustar will not allocate telephone numbers to Applicant until two things occur: the application in this docket is approved; and the Commission approves an interconnection agreement between Applicant and the incumbent local exchange carrier for the geographic area that Applicant seeks an allocation of telephone numbers. Like all voice over Internet providers ("VoIP"), Telesphere Networks Ltd. (the VoIP provider affiliated with Telesphere Access, LLC), must purchase the right to use numbers from competitive local exchange carriers licensed and operating in the geographic areas associated with the numbers desired.

STF 4.2 No, Applicant does not have an interconnection agreement ("ICA") with any incumbent local exchange carrier in Arizona. Applicant is not entitled to request negotiations for an ICA until the authority requested in this docket is granted.

STF 4.6 Applicant has not provided any telephone numbers in Arizona. Telesphere Networks Ltd. has provided through its CLEC partners' telephone numbers to end users in Arizona for the NPA-NXXs as listed on the attached spreadsheet.

STF 4.7 Applicant has not provided any telephone numbers in Arizona. Telesphere Networks Ltd. has provided through its CLEC partners 28,188 telephone numbers in Arizona as of December 31, 2010.

STF 4.8 Applicant has not provided any directory listings in Arizona as of December 31, 2010. Telesphere Networks Ltd. has provided 1066 directory listings in Arizona as of December 31, 2010, through its CLEC partners. The names of the directories are as follows: Qwest Dex White Pages.
