**PETITION FOR LEAVE TO
INTERVENE OF SOLOMON
INDUSTRIES LLC**

Pursuant to the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Arizona Corporation

Commission ("Commission"), Solomon Industries LLC hereby petitions for leave to
intervene in the above-captioned docket and, in support thereof, states as follows:

Solomon Industries LLC

1. Solomon Industries LLC ("SI") is a limited liability corporation organized under
the laws of the State of Ohio. SI holds the marketing and development rights in the
United States to two technologies known as Gas Plasma technology and Aquex
Technology Inc.

1 Gas Plasma technology is the leading green technology designed for the de-
2 construction of any form of waste. The Gas Plasma process occurs in an enclosed vessel,
3 and destroys all toxic and hazardous wastes without creating any toxic or hazardous
4 emissions or residues. The process renders formerly solid wastes or sludges, whatever the
5 chosen input, into an inert plasma rock. The rock consists of only 1% of the feedstock's
6 original volume. The technology is so efficient that it also provides syngas which can
7 then be used to generate significant amounts of electricity based upon the volume of
8 wastes processed. For additional information on the Gas Plasma process please see:

10 Gas Plasma technology may also be combined with the most efficient de-watering
11 technology known, Aquex Technology Inc. What this system does is separate water from
12 any substance including sewage, industrial and commercial wastes and turns the solids
13 into clean burnable materials .

14 The water extracted can be treated and made to conform to drinking water
15 standards. Aquex units can be located in any place in Arizona and purify the water there
16 no matter what the consistency. The units can be stationary or portable and there are
17 many sizes available, portable units are fully self-contained and can be moved from site
18 to site if required, and require little space.

19 2. SI has not previously intervened in any proceeding before the Commission.
20 However SI is concerned that the Commission's decision regarding treatment of
21 incineration be limited in scope and effect only to electric generation derived from
22 traditional types of waste incineration. Any decision should distinguish the Gas Plasma
23 technology from traditional incineration facilities and not deleteriously impact the status

1 of electricity generated from the syngas output of Gas Plasma units. This would apply to
2 the Commission's decisions and rules on energy production, renewable energy, energy
3 efficiency, and the Renewable Energy Standard and Tariff Rules

4 3. Intervention by SI will not unduly broaden the issues or delay the proceeding.

5 4. SI requests that all pleadings, correspondence, discovery, and other forms of
6 documents be served on the following:
