



The Commission will hold a hearing on Mosaic's application on September 12, 2011, at 10:00 a.m., at the Commission's Offices, 1200 West Washington Street, 2nd Floor Conference Room, Phoenix, Arizona. Public comments will be taken on the first day of the hearing. Written public comments may be submitted via email (for instructions go to <http://www.azcc.com/Divisions/Utilities/consumerservices.asp>) or by mailing a letter referencing Docket No T-20777A-10-0510 to: Arizona Corporation Commission, Consumer Services Section, 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, AZ 85007. The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested parties may intervene. Any person or entity entitled by law to intervene and having a direct and substantial interest in the matter will be permitted to intervene. If you would like to intervene, you must file a written motion to intervene with the Commission, and you must send copies of the motion to Mosaic or its counsel and to all parties of record in the case. Your motion to intervene must contain the following:

1. The name, address and telephone number of the proposed intervenor and of any person upon whom service of documents is to be made if different from the intervenor;

2. A short statement of the proposed intervenor's interest in the proceeding (e.g., a customer of the Company, a shareholder of the Company, etc.); and

3. A statement certifying that a copy of the motion to intervene has been mailed to the Company or its counsel and to all parties of record in the case.

The granting of motions to intervene shall be governed by A.A.C. R14-3-109, except that all motions to intervene must be filed on or before August 19, 2011. The granting of intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at the hearing and to cross examine other witnesses. However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested person or entity from appearing at the hearing and making a statement on their own behalf. If representation by counsel is required under Arizona Supreme Court Rules 31 and 39, intervention will be conditioned upon the intervenor obtaining counsel to represent the intervenor.

The Commission does not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission to its public meetings. **IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF MOSAIC NETWORK, LLC FOR APPROVAL OF A CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY TO PROVIDE FACILITIES-BASED LOCAL EXCHANGE AND RESOLD AND FACILITIES-BASED INTRALATA AND INTERLATA PRIVATE LINE TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICES IN ARIZONA.**

**(DOCKET NO. T-20777A-10-0510)**

On December 20, 2010, Mosaic Network LLC ("Mosaic" or "Company") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application for approval of a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CC&N") to provide facilities-based local exchange and resold and facilities-based IntraLATA and interLATA private line telecommunication services throughout Arizona. Mosaic's application also requests a determination that its proposed services are competitive within Arizona. The Commission's Utilities Division ("Staff") has recommended Commission approval of Mosaic's application, subject to certain conditions. The Commission will issue a Decision following consideration of testimony and evidence presented at an evidentiary hearing. The Commission is not bound by the proposals made by Mosaic, Staff, or intervenors. If Mosaic's application is approved, Mosaic will be required to provide service under the rates, charges, terms and conditions established by the Commission.
