As homeowners, we have a choice in how we want to finance our solar installation. After taking a number of factors into account, we chose to lease our solar system. We were able to do this, thanks in part, to the incentives offered by our utility company, APS.

As homeowners, we pay the renewal energy surcharges every month, just as my neighbors do. In fact, all residential customers pay in equally to the RES and should therefore receive the same solar incentives, regardless of how they choose to finance their solar system.

We believe that solar leases have made solar more available to a wider array of homeowners, especially, to homeowners like us that are retired and on fixed incomes.

I encourage the ACC not to allow utilities to penalize those of us who chose to acquire our systems in this manner. Doing so would be discriminatory and unfair.

Please do not threaten the availability of affordable and accessible solar installations by decreasing the amount of rebate incentives allowed for the solar lease.
