Unfortunately, I will be out of town when this meeting is held. I have a fact that it is important for you to know, however. APS HAS BEEN MISIMFORMING CUSTOMERS OF WHAT THEY ARE REQUESTING. I have told them this and have received no response other than, in effect, a "whops." Here are the specifics. In a public notice they sent out to their customers they said: "In addition, APS' application seeks to establish a decoupling mechanism to remove utility disincentives for energy efficiency and distributed generation and improve the recovery of costs the do not vary with electric usage." This didn't seem to make sense to me so I called them to get more information. They do NOT intend to remove disincetives. Removing disincentives would make energy efficiency and distributed generation more attractive to the consumer. They intend to do just the opposite. They want to increase the costs to consumers who do things like install solar. This is bad for the city, the state, the country, and the world (although it would give APS more money). We need MORE energy efficiency, not less. Also, it may result in a class action suit that customers would have to pay for since, in the past, they rewarded customers for installing solar and we relied on their information to decide whether it would be cost effective and this would effect decisions that we already make to spend thousands of dollars. SINCE THEY SENT OUT FALSE INFORMATION, I BELIEVE THEIR REQUEST SHOULD BE DENIED OR THEY SHOULD START THE PROCESS OVER AND SEND OUT THE TRUTH. Since they are requesting to do things that are bad for the country, I think their request should be denied. Since they are trying to create a situation that could result in a class action suit that could cost customers a lot of money, I think their request should be denied.
