## Truxton Canyon Water Company ADEQ Status Report

We have been working diligently to come into compliance with ADEQ. Several outstanding issues have been addressed recently.


Required water tests not being on file with ADEQ has been an ongoing issue. In order to prevent this problem from continuing, we have started having the laboratory send the test results directly to ADEQ. Additionally, I am e-mailing all test results as soon as they are received. We recently provided ADEQ with the following water tests which they did not have on file: coliform tests for September, October, & November, 2011; quarterly chlorine reports for all 3 quarters of this year; and the disinfection by-product test for June, 2011.

Our water system has been plagued by leaks in the main transmission line. We are pleased to report that all known leaks have been repaired. We are aware that, eventually, the transmission line will need to be replaced or we will continue to have many leaks. WIFA has awarded Truxton Canyon Water a planning and design grant that will help pay for the engineering on a new transmission line.

The Blending Plan to reduce the level of Arsenic in our water has been submitted to ADEQ. They have asked for a few additional items before it will be approved. Our project engineer is working on these items currently. We hope to obtain approval in the next couple months so we can reduce the Arsenic to an acceptable level. Our customers will be very relieved when this occurs.

As for our status with ADWR, I am currently working on the System Water Plan that was not completed. This should be finished next week and submitted to them. This is the only outstanding item for ADWR.

We will continue our efforts to come into compliance with ADEQ as soon as possible.
