II. Interest in Proceeding:


Community Information and Referral Services (CIR) was designated on July 27, 2010 by the Arizona Corporation Commission (Docket T-00000A-10-0017 1, DECISION NO. 71823) to provide the Federal Communication Commission's "2-1-1" health, human, and community information services access for the State of Arizona. In FY 2011, CIR assisted over 650,000 Arizonans with their information and referral needs. The top referral requested by individuals contacting CIR/211 Arizona was "Utility Assistance". CIR/211 Arizona is asking for intervention in this matter in order to request APS funding for a portion of its CIR/211 Arizona operations, which directly benefit APS and its ratepayers by connecting customers with low-income assistance programs operated by the utility and partners like Arizona Community Action Association, thereby mitigating the number of Arizonans who

are disconnected from their utility service. These connective services assist individuals experiencing great need, as well as the utility, by limiting the bad debt experienced when utility customers cannot pay their bills on time or at all.


