My name is Scott Killingsworth and I am a resident of Arizona who is disabled due to Environmental Illness (EI). My illness makes me sensitive to extremely low levels of chemicals and also electromagnetic fields. EI is an extraordinarily challenging condition, and the only "treatment" that helps me minimize my severe reactions is avoiding the chemicals and electromagnetic fields that make me sick.

As you may be aware, Snowflake has over the past 25 years become a true haven for those of us with Environmental Illness. It is considered by many who are familiar with our illness to be the best established EI community in the world. The EI residents there collectively also make a significant contribution to the local economy.

I am planning to buy land and build in Snowflake within the next year or two, but I cannot move forward with my plans until I am confident that I will not at some point be sickened by a "smart meter" installed on my property. Therefore, as a future member of Snowflake's disabled EI community, I strongly support the establishment of an opt-out program and other measures to protect APS' disabled EHS customers as stated in the three documents filed to Docket #E-00000C-11-0328 by Safer Utilities Network on September 20 and October 31, 2011. I hope that you will be willing to work with us in a spirit of cooperation that will protect those of us who make or plan to make Snowflake our home, with what should be minimal impact on the business operations of APS.
