Please note these recommendations from the American Academy of Environmental Medicine. That a physician composed "academy" would document its recommendations for keeping patients safe should be a red flag to all of you who are publicly elected to represent your constituents. Unless you do not mind being held liable for their health and/or death, continue on your same path to ignore what experts have proven for the past decade - electromagnetic and radiofrequencies can cause harm and death.

"The AAEM recommends that physicians consider patients' total electromagnetic exposure in their diagnosis and treatment, as well as recognition that electromagnetic and radiofrequency field exposure may be an underlying cause of a patient's disease process.

Based on double-blinded, placebo controlled research in humans¹ medical conditions and disabilities that would more than likely benefit from avoiding electromagnetic and radiofrequency exposure include, but are not limited to:

- Neurological conditions such as paresthesias, somnolence, cephalgia, dizziness, unconsciousness, depression
• Musculoskeletal effects including pain, muscle tightness, spasm, fibrillation
• Heart disease and vascular effects including arrhythmia, tachycardia, flushing, Edema
• Pulmonary conditions including chest tightness, dyspnea, decreased pulmonary function

- Gastrointestinal conditions including nausea, belching
- Ocular (burning)
- Oral (pressure in ears, tooth pain)
- Dermal (itching, burning, pain)
- Autonomic nervous system dysfunction (dysautonomia).

Based on numerous studies showing harmful biological effects from EMF and RF exposure, medical conditions and disabilities that would more than likely benefit from avoiding exposure include, but are not limited to:

- Neurodegenerative diseases (Parkinson's Disease, Alzheimer's Disease, and Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis. ²⁻⁶)
- Neurological conditions (Headaches, depression, sleep disruption, fatigue, dizziness, tremors, autonomic nervous system dysfunction, decreased memory, attention deficit disorder, anxiety, visual disruption). ⁷⁻¹⁰
- Fetal abnormalities and pregnancy. ^{11,12}
- Genetic defects and cancer. ^{2,3,13-19}
- Liver disease and genitourinary disease. ^{12, 20}

Because Smart Meters produce Radiofrequency emissions, it is recommended that patients with the above conditions and disabilities be accommodated to protect their health. The AAEM recommends:

that no Smart Meters be on these patients' homes, that Smart Meters be removed within a reasonable distance of patients' homes depending on the patients' perception and/or symptoms, and that no collection meters be placed near patients' homes depending on patients' perception and/or symptoms.

TEP had the ability build the new UniSource Building when other businesses were hurting—doesn't this show that their profit margin is high enough. Although I don't want more under-employed or unemployed in Tucson, a rate increase would hurt a larger majority than TEP finding means to avoid a rate increase.

I have been struggling and doing without since the housing market collapsed. I am wearing shoes that has no support left, have not gone on vacation since 2008, eating meatless meals, sweating without air conditioning many days, having very basic cable & internet, having minimum car insurance, wearing clothes until they are falling apart, and have made many other sacrifices to stretch my limited resources, but I still need to keep a credit card balance. Most days I am optimistic since at least I have something to eat even if it is meatless most days when others are not able to eat (I have invited my nephew over for many of dinners when he has been unable to eat all day and he is working to part-time jobs unable to find full-time employment), but having my electric bill increased will be a devastating blow to me & many others in Tucson.

Good Morning Rob,

If you will open the attachment, which is a copy of the letter that my Dad has just received from APS, you will find that it is a **thank you letter** for **requesting** an installation pamphlet. As you know from having read the letter I sent to the Chairman of the Arizona Corporation and copied to you, this is the precise **opposite** of what I asked for and was promised, namely an APS letter of confirmation of our [*my Dad and I*] request to **opt-out** of the installation of the new APS Smart Meter due to medical reasons which they said they understood. Rob, sending of this letter is no accident and constitutes more than an outrage. Telling me that my property will have to be designated a "**dangerous property**" in order to qualify for grant of our opt-out request to APS was bad enough, but this borders on criminality by design. I know what is going to happen next. An APS installer, unannounced and without permission, is going to trespass on my property and install a Smart Meter as if they had never heard from my Dad and me. **They will be willing to put my elderly father's life in jeopardy** at worst and, at best, to create a great deal of stress for him.
