**ORDER EXTENDING TIME

Having considered the entire record herein and being fully advised in the premises, the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") finds, concludes, and orders that:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On July 31, 1997, the Commission issued Decision No. 60344 in Case No. 88. Decision No. 60344 granted Citizens Utility Company a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility ("CEC" or "Certificate") authorizing construction of a 230/69 kV double circuit transmission line, associated substations, and related facilities in Mohave County. The CEC was granted upon three conditions, one of which is that the authorization to construct the project would expire ten years from the date the Certificate is approved by the Commission unless construction is completed by that time; provided, however, that prior to such expiration the facility owner may request that the Commission extend the time limitation.

1 2. On November 2, 2005, Citizens Utilities Company's successor in interest, UNS
2 Electric, Inc. ("UNS Electric" or "Company") filed with the Commission a request for an extension
3 of time of the deadline for completion of construction of a portion of the facilities certificated by
4 Decision No. 60344. The portion of the certificated facilities for which UNS Electric requested a
5 time extension is the final 28-mile portion of the 230/69 kV double circuit transmission line, from the
6 Griffith substation to the Franconia Substation ("Project").

7 3. On July 30, 2007, the Commission issued Decision No. 69721. Decision No. 69721
8 amended Decision No. 60344 to extend the deadline for completion of the Project to July 31, 2012.
9 Decision No. 69721 also ordered the Company to erect and maintain signs in public rights-of-way for
10 the Project providing public notice that the property is the site of a future transmission line, and to
11 report sign placement annually to the Director of the Commission's Utilities Division.

12 4. On March 6, 2012, UNS Electric filed a new Request for Extension of Time. UNS
13 Electric requests that the deadline for completion of the Project be extended again, to July 31, 2022.
14 UNS Electric states that it has not yet commenced construction of the Project because load growth in
15 the area has not kept pace with earlier projections. UNS Electric states that the cost of constructing
16 that portion of the line is not justified at this time, because the system is currently supplying
17 customers with reliable power without the need for additional transmission capacity. UNS Electric
18 states the need for increased capacity into the Lake Havasu area is not projected to manifest for
19 another 5 to 10 years. UNS Electric asserts that the Company and its customers will benefit by
20 delaying the financial obligation associated with the construction, and that a 10 year extension of
21 time is appropriate, because it will allow the Company to construct the Project when it is needed.

22 5. On June 1, 2012, the Commission's Utilities Division ("Staff") filed a Memorandum in
23 this docket recommending that the requested extension of time for construction of the Project be
24 granted.

25 6. In its Memorandum, Staff states that depressed market economic conditions have
26 produced actual load growth far less than was anticipated when the CEC was granted. Staff notes

1 that Staff's Sixth Biennial Transmission Assessment¹ found that the ten year 2010-2019 load
2 projection for the entire state was off by four years, that UNS Electric's system was adequate and
3 reliable in providing service to meet customer needs for the foreseeable future; and that the Project
4 will not be needed until 2016 and beyond.

5 7. Staff states that it agrees with the Company that, in the absence of need for the Project,
6 its construction is not in the public interest at this time, but that construction may be warranted in the
7 future when appropriate load growth conditions dictate. Staff recommends approval of the requested
8 time extension from July 31, 2012 to July 31, 2022.

9 8. Staff further recommends that no further extension of time be granted for completion of
10 the Project, and recommends that if the Project is not needed by July 31, 2022, that UNS Electric be
11 required to apply for a new CEC.

12 9. UNS Electric did not file a response to the Staff Memorandum.

13 10. Good cause exists to grant the extension of time requested by UNS Electric.

14 11. Staff's recommendations are reasonable and should be adopted.

15 12. UNS Electric should be ordered to continue to maintain the signs ordered by Decision
16 No. 69127 in public rights-of-way for the Project providing public notice that the property is the site
17 of a future transmission line. In lieu of making the annual filing reporting sign placement with the
18 Commission's Utilities Division Director as ordered by Decision No. 69127, UNS Electric should be
19 required to make the annual filing with Docket Control, as a compliance item in this matter.

20 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

21 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over UNS Electric and the subject matter contained
22 herein pursuant to Article XV of the Arizona Constitution and A.R.S. §40-252 and §40-360 *et seq.*

23 2. Notice of the proceeding has been given in the manner prescribed by law.

24 3. Amending Decision No. 60344 as amended by Decision No. 69721, as set forth
25 herein, is in the public interest.

27 ¹ The Sixth Biennial Transmission Assessment, 2010-2019, filed on November 8, 2010, was issued as the Commission's
28 biennial assessment in accordance with Arizona Revised Statutes 40-360.02.G by Decision No. 72031 (December 10,
2010).


1 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all other provisions of Decision No. 60344, as amended by


