11.2 REGULATIONS (Cont'd)

11.2.2 ENGINEERING

The Carrier will engineer to the specifications and parameters of the service provided. The Carrier publishes certain technical information that the Customer can obtain in the form of Technical Publications. (See Technical Publication Information)

11.2.3 INSTALLATION

When installation of a component is required, it will be installed subject to the availability of installation personnel and equipment. Installations will usually be made during normal working hours.

11.2.4 MAINTENANCE

The Carrier will maintain and repair the services that it provides.

11.3 MILEAGE MEASUREMENTS

11.3.1 MILEAGE DETERMINATION

To determine the airline mileage between any two Company Central Offices, see the Company's Business Services Guides, proceed as follows:

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- a. Obtain the "V" and "H" coordinates for each Central Office.
- b. Obtain the difference between the "V" coordinates of the two points. Obtain the difference between the "H" coordinates.
- c. Square each difference obtained in B. preceding.
- d. Add the squares of the "V" difference and the "H" difference obtained in B. preceding.
- e. Divide the sum of the squares obtained in d. preceding by 10. Round to the next higher whole number if any fraction is obtained.
- f. Obtain the square root of the result obtained in e. preceding. This is the airline distance in miles (Fractional miles are rounded to the next higher whole number).

11.4 RATES AND CHARGES

The Carrier will not allocate the usage of a Custom Network Service or the charges for such usage and is not responsible for the way the Customer may allocate usage or charges among multiple users. The charge for Switched Digital Service consists of a recurring charge element that is usage based. This usage charge applies to all completed calls. The applicable usage charges also depend on whether the call is between (1) access lines (two-point), (2) Switched Digital Service Central offices (two-point or multipoint) or (3) an access line and an AT&T Central office (multipoint). Mileage rates vary by airline mileage between central offices and by the time of day and day of week that a call is placed. In addition, a switched access usage charge will apply to all calls using switched access lines.

The rates for a call between access lines within the same Company Switched Digital Service Central Office are zero airline mileage rates.

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The following applies for a Switched Digital Service call:

The initial period is the rate element for the initial 30 seconds, or fraction thereof, of a call.

The additional period is the rate element used to bill for the chargeable time when a call continues beyond the initial period. The additional period begins when the initial period ends. Additional period rates apply to each additional six seconds, or any fraction thereof, that chargeable time continues beyond the initial period.

11.4.1 SDS Volume Plan

The SDS Volume Plan offers special usage rates for new or existing customers who sign up for a 1, 2, or 3 year term plan and commit to incurring at least \$50 - \$16,500 per month (\$600 - \$198,000 annually) in gross annual revenue.

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SECTION 11 - SWITCHED DIGITAL SERVICE

11.5 ACCESS LINES

A special access line or a switched access line is required to connect a Customer's premises to a Switched Digital Central Office.

Access lines are obtained from the Company's Business Services Guide. (T)

Access lines provided by the Company for use with Switched Digital Service are subject to the regulations of the tariffs under which they are furnished. (T)

Access lines for use with Switched Digital Service may also be provided by the Customer and must be electrically compatible. The Carrier is not responsible for the performance and maintenance of access lines provided by others. The Customer must make all the arrangements concerning the connected service with its provider of the service.

Switched access lines are available as specified in the Company's Business Services Guide. (T)

11.6 CREDIT ALLOWANCES FOR INTERRUPTIONS

A credit allowance will be made for a Switched Digital Service call, which is interrupted due to the failure of a component, furnished under this tariff which results in:

- One-way transmission (one party unable to transmit to the other), or
- Involuntary disconnection (cut-off) of the call.

To receive the proper credit, the Customer must notify the Carrier and furnish the called number, the trouble experienced and the approximate time the call was placed. Credit allowances for access lines are as set forth in the tariffs under which they are furnished.

When a call, which is billed under this tariff, is interrupted due to a cut-off, one-way transmission, or poor transmission condition, the Customer will receive credit equivalent to six seconds (i.e., the last six seconds of the call).
