INSERT FINDINGS OF FACT Page 20, Line 28, the following new paragraph:

“The final round of the APS small generation renewable resources program was approved without a firm timeline. This should be addressed to provide market predictability.”

INSERT at Page 26, Line 1, the following new paragraph:

“IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that APS shall issue competitive RFPs under the small generation renewable resources program for 30 MW, making awards in 2013 for 2014 or 2015 commissioning dates.”

Page 20, Line 28

INSERT new Finding of Fact: The 2012 modifications to the E-32 L rate have had the consequence of negatively impacting customers who have already committed to solar and discourages future commitments to solar. The Commission believes this problem should be addressed and believes that stakeholders should work together to propose a solution within 2 months of this hearing.
