I recently (approximately 18 months ago) installed a solar array on my home to take advantage of AZ sunshine and become part of the power generation solution. In order to do so, I was required to sign onto a 20-year solar lease, the financial efficacy of which is dependent on our utilities - who also must sign off on the arrangements and inspect and approve each such system - paying for the excess power that I personally provide to their system when I generate more power than I use in a given day. All such power is like money deposited in their account - and if they do not acknowledge and credit such receipt, they are effectively stealing a resource that is being provided to them by customers with no overhead or equipment responsibility falling upon the utilities themselves. Essentially, it is a ready-made power plant for their use, without their having had to spend a cent to build or maintain it. It would be the equivalent of all utility customers getting a court order that allows us to not pay for the net power we use each year, without the utility companies being able to collect on those power bills OR terminate their providing of such unpaid for power to their customers.
