Dear Commissioner Bitter-Smith,

I understand that the Corporation Commission is considering a change in how solar energy is metered by APS. At the present time, the solar energy that our solar system generates is credited by APS so that our energy bills are lowered substantially each month. Our system was installed in December, 2012 at the cost of \$36,000. We decided to make this investment in our home so that, as we grow older, we will be protected from ever higher energy bills. At age 68, we were looking ahead and seeing higher and higher energy bills in our future. Because our home and community is 100% electric, the cost of electricity is a major expense for my husband and myself.

I urge the board to maintain the partnership that solar energy owners now have with our APS. The system is mutually beneficial. Although we are saving on our electricity bills, we continue to pay full APS prices for any extra energy that we use beyond what we generate. Further, when we generate more electricity than we need, at year's end APS buys that extra energy from us for less than they charge customers. Thus, APS profits from the output of our solar system.

I urge you as a member of the Corporation Commission to see that this partnership that we have with APS be maintained and that solar system owners be given credit for all the electricity they generate. If the Commission agrees to a change that would reduce the credit customers receive from APS for solar energy they generate, that change would hurt all of us who have tried to do the right thing by investing in solar. And it would destroy the solar industry in our state. The solar industry can, as prices for systems drop, be more and more important to the Arizona economy and needs to be encouraged, not squashed.
