Two weeks ago, on a Saturday morning in May, we checked our solar meter and found that we were making more power than we were using, despite simultaneously running the air conditioner, the television, the washing machine, and the dishwasher. We provide a valuable service to the power company and to the state as a whole. There is no reason we should be penalized for this.

I know that due to my extreme measures to limit the need for cooling during the summer I am a net generator of power during peak time-of-use periods during summer months. Basically, I limit the air conditioner to run only if I have used less than 1.5 kWh in an hour. Otherwise the system will not run until the next hour. Because I have spent money on a tight home and a 17 SEER, two compressor, air conditioner I cool the house to 72 degrees using off-peak power and then let the temperature drift upwards until 8:00 PM, at which time the house gradually returns to 72 degrees and thermal banks coolness for the next day.
