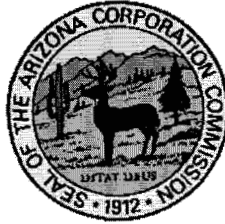

We are well into our fourth year of producing electricity from the sun for our own use and sharing our excess with our neighbors in the Sulphur Springs Valley Electric Cooperative (SSVEC). We have generated 33.313 Megawatt hours (MWh) so far, and returned 6.854 MWh to the grid. We were the first Performance Based Incentive (PBI) contract that SSVEC did in 2011. The 6.854 MWh was exchanged at 12.7 cents per KWh, the current residential rate here in Sierra Vista. At the time, the PBI for a 15 year contract was 18.7 cents per KWh generated. That payment stops when we reach the incentive limit. In a recent mailing I received it stated that the current rate is now 8.7 cents per KWh.

The 60 Plus Association wanted me to tell you, "The current net metering system is hurting Arizonans, particularly seniors and those on fixed incomes.

We know that solar customers create their own energy, but they still rely on the energy grid to ensure they have power whenever they need it. When they don't pay for that service, the rates we pay go up. Furthermore, the current net metering policy requires us to pay five times the market value for solar customers' excess power."

I am not sure on what they base these statements, but I know that I pay for being connected to the grid, and that I pay Arizona and Federal Income Tax on the PBI payments that I receive. I also know that the power we produce reduces the amount of power SSVEC has to buy and transport from the central generation plants. We also produce our peak power during the peak demand periods, thus reducing SSVEC's peak power generation costs.

So I would ask you to take a careful look at the true costs and benefits of distributed cooperative electricity generation as you revise the rate structure. We have been blessed with abundant sun here in Arizona, and we should use it wisely for everyone's benefits.
