Several months ago, I sent an email in response to a Call to Action from the Arizona School Business Officials Association concerning Arizona's net metering policies and the potential for them being changed. Since sending that email, I have received further information about the net metering issue currently before the Arizona Corporation Commission (ACC). I now recognize that the proposed changes being considered at this time will not impact the Washington Elementary School District. I am, therefore, clarifying my previous communication to you.

The current net metering policy for our school facilities is an essential part of the cost formula that makes solar possible for public school districts working to save tax-payers' dollars.
