As Mayor of Goodyear, I am encouraged by the opportunities the solar industry can provide for the residents of our community and the State of Arizona.

Issues related to the use and compensation of solar power must be addressed in order to realize our state's solar potential. I sincerely hope all available alternatives are explored leading to a fair and equitable solution for all parties involved. They have not hesitated to express those concerns. They believe in solar power as a clean energy alternative for the future, and they want to be assured that we allow the industry to flourish.

I realize that solar installations have exceeded projections and I understand APS' concerns about the financial sustainability of the industry's continued growth. However, as an ambassador and supporter of the solar industry, I want to continue to represent the views of our residents who were encouraged and congratulated for their decision to personally invest in the generation of solar power.

I encourage all parties involved to compromise and explore alternatives that will allow Arizona's solar industry to grow and prosper in a way that is sustainable for the future.
