

Comments

:In November 2009, REC Solar installed a 28 solar panel assembly on my 2 story house. My house faces due south (true orientation 179 degrees) and my roof slope is 22 degrees. REC solar installed a SB 5000-US Sunny Boy inverter, capable of converting the solar panel DC power to AC power to be used for residential and grid consumption. The system has operated with out any operational/mechanical demand from REC or APS since November 2009. The solar panels are producing AC power at 120 to 122 volts. Since November 2009 the solar panels have created 47,005 KWh of power. The inverter has calculated that the solar panels have kept APS from emitting 47,005 pounds of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere from combustion generation. APS has not paid any money for the maintenance or operation of the solar cells and converter. The solar panels have delivered power equal to or greater than 120 volts to the grid in their neighborhood, helping to reduce any brown-out condition during high energy consumption days. APS has not given the residential solar panel owners any credit for the reduction of carbon dioxide emissions. It seems that APS is trying to flex its monopolistic muscle for its owners. Has APS mentioned the carbon dioxide emission savings in its recent request for solar panel owners to pay a penalty? All the residents are benefiting from less emission of carbon dioxide. Please do not approve the
