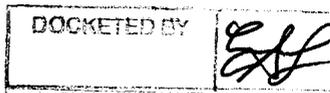

Commissioner Burns:

Following are responses to your questions asked in your letter to this docket dated October 30, 2013.

1) *How much money did your company, organization, shareholders, members, and/or parent company spend concerning net metering? Your answers should include funds spent to support lobbying efforts and contributions to organizations that lobby or retain lobbyists to promote supporting views.*

Duncan Valley Electric Cooperative has not spent any money on net metering including supporting lobbying efforts or contributions to organizations that lobby or retain lobbyists to promote supporting views.

2) *Please identify the approximate number of hours your salaried staff spent on the public relations campaign to support your positions.*

Duncan Valley Electric Cooperative salaried employees have not spent any hours on public relations campaigns to support positions on net metering.

3) *If you are a regulated utility, will you be seeking to recover in a future rate case (i.e., through operation and administrative costs, etc.) funds expended to promote your views?*

Duncan Valley Electric Cooperative will not be seeking to recover in a future rate case funds expended to promote its views on net metering.

Finally, Duncan Valley Electric Cooperative requests that the Commission not attempt to use a one-size fits all policy on net metering because the Staff and APS net metering proposals and what will be adopted by the Commission for APS will most likely not be appropriate or applicable for electric cooperatives.
