I urge you to protect solar progress and a strong rooftop solar program in Arizona.

Arizona is now the national leader in solar energy production per capita due to the "net metering" policy that allows customers who have installed solar on their homes or businesses to receive fair market value for any excess energy that is sent back into the grid.

The net-metering policy produces substantial benefits. Solar producing customers are compensated fairly for excess energy generated. Other utility customers benefit by receiving clean, renewable energy through the grid. Progress in solar energy also reduces the need for costly new power plants and transmission lines, creates high-paying local jobs, and results in cleaner air for people and our environment.

The Commission's staff recently recommended that the ACC reject Arizona Public Service and instead address issues in 2016 in the next APS rate case. We do not envy your position as you weigh the various arguments surrounding the net metering debate. Whether there is a net cost shift or net benefit, we will not take a position as to what the right answer is and where the solution should rest. However, because we are deeply involved with and concerned with the long term prosperity of our fine state, we felt as though another key perspective should be voiced.

As a leading bank in this State, which has supported the energy future through financing various significant projects, we truly believe that policy consistency is the key to ensuring long term capital stability.

Energy projects are a long term financing considerations, predicated on the understanding that the revenues generated to support the debt or equity repayment will have minimal, if any, variability. For example, a fixed charge should be established and locked for a long period of time. Whatever policy decision is made with regard to net metering, it must be done for and with a long term perspective. If this occurs, capital will support our long term energy future.
