It is my understanding that the Commission is reviewing the Arizona Public Service program which encouraged the replacement of outdated lighting with modern, more efficient products.

I want to encourage you and the Commission to continue the funding for this program. In fact, I would recommend expanding it.

I employ ten people full time and another 10 part time. My firm conducts highly technical work and we require inspection and laboratory facilities which mean we need space. Our location is South Phoenix is near ideal.

But as a small company I am always looking to be more efficient. As an engineer I understand the value of installing more efficient products. Through the APS program we upgraded interior and exterior lighting, improving our security, working conditions, all while saving an estimated 25% on lighting costs. The decrease in our use of energy means the existing infrastructure can go farther. That is good for everyone.
