Dear Mr. Olea:

I have written to the Arizona Corp. Commission on several occasions regarding issues of this complaint. I received a reply once in what i would term as a smirk attitude.

It is becoming increasingly clear that this office has one interest in mind ,and it doesn't involve the safety and well being of the general public.

this is based on several factors that have been continually ignored by the ACC

1. I spent a lot of time gathering signatures around the community where i live (Junipine Estates) asking for a moratorium on the installation of these smart meters as to the growing controversy of them catching fire , health issues ranging from nausea headaches heart palpitations insomnia ect. which APS explains away as myth with an unsigned dime store brochure that wouldn't even begin to hold up in a court of law.

What i had requested from the ACC was a signed statement of proof assurance by APS head official that these meters pose none of the above dangers. ( no response) This is what roughly 100 concerned residents of this community got for signing the petition.

2. The ACC finally agreed to do a year long study on the potential of health and safety danger to the public from these meters ,while at the same time, granting APS permission to continue installing the

meters, before the outcome of this study. What kind of competence is this?

3.APS claims that people can opt out if they choose. That is admirable, if it weren't for the fact that when i was doing the petition drive, i ran into scores of people who didn't know what a smart meter was , didn't know it had even been tnstalled on their property until i showed it to them, or even aware of the potential for health and safety issues.

4.I believe the Az. Corp. Comm. was established to regulate and oversee the safety of the public on situations such as this. Instead it seems they are more concerned with the utilities profit margin.5.There is presently no law i know of that says you have to have these meters, much less pay a fee to opt out of a program that you never had a choice to opt into in the first place.

5. APS just took it on themselves to start changing these meters without even asking the people if they wanted one.

I recently had a smart meter on my rental next door to my house removed, and an analog meter reinstalled when the rental was vacant, and i was paying the utilities there. I didn't want the smart meter there in the 1st place ,but i was told that, only the renter could make that choice because they pay the utilities there.

That residence is deeded to my wife and i,We pay the property taxes,I feel it is my obligation to assure to the people i rent to that every thing on that property is safe.

I can't do that if APS is allowed to overstep that authority. Therefore ,before there is ever a smart meter installed on that property again, i want what i requested from the ACC (.Proof Assurance) A legal and binding signed statement from the head official in APS stating that that smart meter will pose no threat to my renters concerning health issues ,fire danger or privacy violations ,or the current analog meter stays in place.
