On February 27, 2014, Arizona Department of Transportation ("Applicant") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") applications for approval for the Arizona Eastern Railway Company ("Railroad") to upgrade the following existing crossings located at the Railroad's tracks: at Navajo Road in Bylas, Arizona, at AAR/DOT NO. 742-309Y; at Home Alone Road in Bylas, Arizona, at AAR/DOT NO. 742-307K; and at Centerpoint Entrance in Bylas, Arizona, at AAR/DOT NO. 742-306D.

The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested parties may intervene.

The Commission will hold a hearing on this matter commencing on June 2, 2014, at 11:00 a.m., at the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington Street, Hearing Room No.2, Phoenix, Arizona. Public comments will be taken on the first day of the hearing.

The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested parties may intervene. Intervention shall be permitted to any person entitled by law to intervene and having a direct and substantial interest in the matter. Persons desiring to intervene must file a written motion to intervene with the Commission, which motion should be sent to Applicant or its counsel and to all parties of record, and which, at the minimum, shall contain the following:

1. The name, address, and telephone number of the proposed intervener and of any party upon whom service of documents is to be made if different than the intervener.
2. A short statement of the proposed intervener's interest in the proceeding (e.g., a customer of Railroad, a neighboring property owner, a crossing user, etc.).
3. A statement certifying that a copy of the motion to intervene has been mailed to the Applicant or its counsel and to all parties of record in the case.

The granting of motions to intervene shall be governed by A.A.C. R14-3-105, except that **all motions to intervene must be filed on or before May 15, 2014.** The granting of intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at hearing and to cross-examine other witnesses. **However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested person from appearing at the hearing and making a statement on such person's own behalf.**
