IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF PINAL COUNTY FOR APPROVAL TO MODIFY AN EXISTING CROSSING OF THE COPPER BASIN RAILWAY AS PART OF THE PROPOSED KELVIN BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT IN PINAL COUNTY, ARIZONA, AT USDOT NO. 742-396E (DOCKET NO. RR-02636A-14-0181).

On June 6, 2014, Pinal County ("County") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application for approval for the Copper Basin Railway Company ("Railroad") to modify an existing crossing as part of the proposed Kelvin Bridge Replacement Project in Pinal County, Arizona at USDOT No. 742-396E. The application is available for inspection during regular business hours at the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington Street, Phoenix, Arizona, and on the internet via the Commission website (www.azcc.gov) using the e-docket function. The Commission will hold a hearing on this matter commencing on September 3, 2014, at 10:00 a.m., at the Commission's offices, 1200 West Washington Street, Hearing Room No. 1, Phoenix, Arizona. Public comments will be taken on the first day of the hearing.

The law provides for an open public hearing at which, under appropriate circumstances, interested parties may intervene. Intervention shall be permitted to any person entitled by law to intervene and having a direct and substantial interest in the matter. Persons desiring to intervene must file a written motion to intervene with the Commission, which motion should be sent to Applicant or its counsel and to all parties of record, and which, at the minimum, shall contain the following:

1. The name, address, and telephone number of the proposed intervenor and of any party upon whom service of documents is to be made if different than the intervenor.

2. A short statement of the proposed intervenor's interest in the proceeding (e.g., a customer of Railroad, a neighboring property owner, a crossing user, etc.).

3. A statement certifying that a copy of the motion to intervene has been mailed to the Applicant or its counsel and to all parties of record in the case.

The granting of motions to intervene shall be governed by A.A.C. R14-3-105, except that all motions to intervene must be filed on or before August 4, 2014. The granting of intervention, among other things, entitles a party to present sworn evidence at hearing and to cross-examine other witnesses. However, failure to intervene will not preclude any interested party from appearing at the hearing and making a statement on such person's own behalf.





Pinal Rural Fire Rescue forming district

Pinal Rural Fire Rescue is forming a new fire district. The new district will be known as the Pinal Rural Fire Rescue and Medical District. Pinal

Rural has filed an Impact Statement with the Clerk of the Pinal County Board of Supervisors which is the first step in the process of transforming from a 501 (c)(3) to a Special Tax District per Arizona Revised Statutes

48-261. The creation of a fire district will allow Pinal Rural Fire and Rescue (PRF&R) to provide dedicated service by a permanent fire district. It will allow for capital planning based on a

known annual budget. Added revenues will allow PRF&R to hire shift firefighters and provide the ability to pay stipends to local volunteer staffing. Property owners living in the district will be assessed a secondary tax

of \$3 per \$100 of assessed value of their property. There is little difference in the tax fees and the current subscription fees. The new district will allow property owners to get fire insurance and/or have a positive impact on fire insurance fees. In some cases the savings in fire insurance premiums exceeds the tax assessed. Once the district is approved and set up, board members will be elected from property owners in the district. If you would like to follow the progress of

After a report of a non-injury accident on the 300 block of Hartford, a citation was issued for speed/reasonable and prudent.


