As a resident in Verrado (Buckeye, AZ) it has come to my attention that the ACC will be receiving 3 proposals to lower waste water rates in our area. I myself have taken severe precautions to limit my usage to the point I have fake grass, pavers and rock in my backyard. I planted 6 palm tree that need limited water (Mexican Fan palm) and have 4 fruit trees. My family consists of 2 small children that bath every other day and my wife and I. Even with the the low usage my water and waste/water bill exceeds \$150.00 every month, even in the winter months when those trees get watered once every 15 days. I find it absurd that a waste water bill could be so high for such limited use. We are a 1 person working family that are just able to meet our bills each month. Every time my bills go up it hurts us immensely.

It has also come to my attention that elected officials voted in on a 3-2 vote for de-consolidation which skyrocketed Verrado's waste water bills. I also find it convenient that two of the yes votes happen to live in Epcor's Anthem district which serve many of thousand more customers. I find the elected officials who were able to vote on their own water bill in Anthem to be disingenuous. They are representing themselves and not what is best for all involved. Mr. Burns you were not in office for the last vote, but I hope we can expect a consolidation vote from you this time. I am not wanting to hurt other Epcor customers but the fact is that yes vote hurt us significantly. There has to be a better scenario for all involved, Anthem, Suncity, Verrado, etc.

It it my understanding that Epcor is supporting a proposal for consolidation of all waste water locations. I do believe that is what is in the best interest for everyone, not just a select few neighborhoods. Please take the consolidation proposal seriously and don't allow your personal gain/loss to sway a very important decision that you have been elected to represent. I strongly urge you to vote for a move back to consolidated water districts. The deconsolidation of Anthem and Agua Fria districts has had a disastrous effect on the community of Verrado and it's residents such as myself. Just because we have a smaller ( though rapidly growing) population than Anthem, why should we pay much higher wastewater rates? Different water districts should not be pitted against each other in this way! Fully consolidated districts with a single rate structure reflect what consumers experience in most municipal districts. Dear Commissioner:

We are seasonal residents of Verrado. Our home is vacant for the months of June through September. No water is being used inside the home during these months. Water used during these months is for outside landscaping irrigation only, which includes a grass lawn. As you can see from our bill of July 25, 2014, the water used during this billing period was 14,000 gallons, all of which was used for irrigation. However, we were charged for 7,000 gallons of wastewater treatment, none of which occurred, and in my opinion is a dishonest mischarging practice. In fact, when we are in Verrado, our inside water usage averages about 4,000 gallons a month. That means we are still being mischarged for 3,000 gallons per month of wastewater treatment for the months we are there. For this summer alone, I will be charged approximately \$250 for wastewater treatment that did not occur, and for the entire year it will be close to \$530. I urge you as a water district Commissioner to take decisive action to stop these mischarging practices and have Epcor Water Arizona Inc. structure billing commensurate with the services received.

I am writing on behalf of I believe every homeowner and renter in the community of Verrado regarding the water situation we currently face as a result of deregulation. All any homeowner or renter asks is for fairness for what is best for the districts that make up our region of the valley.

Prior to moving to Arizona 10 months ago, my wife and I were longtime residents of the City of Simi Valley in Ventura County, CA. While most expenses in California are higher than here in Arizona, water is not one of those expenses. Our average monthly water bill in Simi was about \$30.00 and the city spread their infrastructure, sewage and other expenses among all residents of the Valley even though it was very obvious that the upscale Wood Ranch area utilized much more water due to a golf course present and a multitude of larger homes with expansive grassy areas.

This decision upcoming by the Arizona Corporation Commission should not be one made from upsetting the residents of Anthem. Mr. Burns,

It has been brought to my attention that you are a person we can reach out to regarding the outrageous rates we are paying for waste water in the Verrado Community in Buckeye, AZ. We have lived in Verrado for 18 months, in a 2000 square foot home. We are a family of two people, yet our water bill is consistently over \$150 per month. In the month of July we were gone for 3 weeks, yet our water bill remained the same. We have minimal vegetation and fake turf in our backyard, yet our bill is triple compared to those on city water. Epcor is uncertain why our bill remains the same, seemingly regardless of use. Our wastewater rates are inexplicable and are placing an undue financial burden on our household. 
There are several reasons that full consolidation makes the most sense from both a short and long term perspective. Please consider:

I hope this e-mail finds you well, and enjoying your career at the ACC. If I forgot to say it before, I appreciated your consideration when I represented the State Banking Department before the Senate when you were President. Since then, Denise and I have moved from Glendale to Verrado (Buckeye), which is the reason for my e-mail to you today.

We in Verrado receive water/sewer service from Epcor, which also services Anthem, much or all of Sun City, and a few other communities. A couple of years ago, the ACC voted to split up the communities within Epcor's purview for rate-paying purposes. As I understand it, the reason for the "de-consolidation" was so that rate payers in Anthem would not have to pay for building water-treatment facilities that were used by Verrado. Correct me if that's wrong.

At one level, it makes sense to make each community pay for their own services. Dear Commissioner,

I am a resident of Verrado, a husband, father, and web developer. We do all right financially, and I am glad that my job pays pretty well, because otherwise we might have to choose between water and food on a monthly basis (we have friends who are on a fixed income a do face that choice). Shortly before my son was born last year, we moved to Verrado from our condo in Tempe where we paid ~\$25-30/month for water and sewer. Compare that to our new home (~2300 sq/ft) where our bill has never been lower than \$155, and has occasional spikes between \$220 and \$300 as I try to revive plants so the HOA doesn't fine us. We do not have a pool, our yard is very small, we never shower for longer than 10 minutes, and wash clothes every three days or so... yet our water bill is the most expensive utility 9/12 months of the year (electricity of course spikes June-August).

Along with air, water is the most basic human need that I can think of, yet we're held hostage by a company whose goal is to profit from that need. Profit will always be the driving motivation for a company and I have no problem with that, as long as they have competition to keep their rates honest. Epcor does not have that because they function in a "natural" (government mandated) monopoly on the water supply. So it's left up to you -the Arizona Corporate Commission - to regulate them and keep them honest. And I do not think you have done your job very well, at least not for your constituents as a whole.

We are a small but growing community, largely populated by a mixture of retirees and young families (such as mine). We don't have the numbers to be as loud as some of the other communities that Epcor "serves", and many of us have jobs that preclude us from joining daytime rallies and such events that other communities may be capable of. But that doesn't change the fact that a heavy burden has been laid on our community and we don't have the power to shed it. When my wife and I were looking for a house, we nearly didn't purchase in Verrado because of how expensive the water is. We did purchase because we love our house and live within a few minutes of her family. But if her family weren't close by, we would not have purchased because, currently, to buy here means to be saddled with a second, smaller mortgage. We personally know families who pay between \$300-450 each month for their water. That is a grievous burden, and not one that comes because of excessive waste!

I didn't live here when Buckeye shirked their duty and sold us to a private company, and ultimately I blame them for the current circumstance. I don't think we'll ever get long-term relief without the City buying us back. But as that's a pipe dream, you are our only source of relief. Please do what you can to help our community as you make your decision regarding Epcor's consolidation status. I don't think it's fair for anyone to pay what we're paying, but just as the cost of shoplifting is built into Target's prices (no benefit to me) Epcor's prices should be evened out across as large a population as possible, even if the increase doesn't benefit an individual.

Please help us as I don't think anyone else can right now.

It's a shame on you, the AZCC, that Epcor is allowed to charge us this stupidly outrageous amount every month.

I'm asking for you to do the RIGHT thing and only allow Epcor to charge fees and rates that are comparable to the rest of the districts in the NW valley. We are not asking for free services, just service rates that are comparable to our district neighbors.
