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

FINDINGS OF FACT

Introduction

1. On October 25, 2014, pursuant to Decision No. 72177 (February 11, 2011) and as modified by Decision No. 73283 (July 30, 2012), Sahuarita Water Company, L.L.C. ("Sahuarita" or "Company") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") the Company's proposed Central Arizona Groundwater Replenishment District ("CAGRD") adjustor fees.

2. Decision No. 72177 authorized the Company to implement an adjustor mechanism, subject to certain conditions, to recover the costs paid to the CAGRD for replenishment of groundwater. The conditions as modified by Decision No. 73283 require the Company to submit, by October 25 of each year, for Commission consideration, its proposed CAGRD fees for the next twelve-month period (along with documentation from the relevant state agencies to support the

1 calculations), to apply to all water sold after December 1. Accordingly, the Company made the  
2 instant filing on October 15, 2014, requesting an adjustor reset for sales billed in 2014.

### 3 Background

4 3. The CAGR D was established by the Arizona legislature to serve as a groundwater  
5 replenishment authority. It provides a mechanism for designated water supply providers, such as  
6 Sahuarita, to demonstrate a 100-year water supply. Members pay the CAGR D to replenish  
7 groundwater pumped by the member that exceeds the specified pumping limits. The CAGR D is  
8 recognized as an important tool in Arizona's groundwater conservation efforts.

### 9 Calculation of the CAGR D Adjustor Fees

10 4. Decision No. 72177 specified nine conditions regarding the CAGR D Adjustor.  
11 Condition No. 6 ordered that the adjustor fees be calculated as follows: "The total CAGR D fees paid  
12 by the Company for the most current year . . . shall be divided by the gallons sold by the Company in  
13 that year to determine a CAGR D adjustor fee per 1,000 gallons."<sup>1</sup>

14 5. In addition, although the Order did not contain an explicit provision for a true-up, the  
15 parties were in agreement that such an annual true-up would occur at the time of the annual adjustor  
16 reset. This understanding was confirmed by the Commission's provision for a true-up in Decision  
17 No. 72204.<sup>2</sup>

18 6. The Company proposes a rate of \$1.15 per thousand gallons. Utilities Division Staff  
19 ("Staff") has reviewed the Company's proposed calculations and the supporting documentation  
20 submitted with its request. Staff agrees with the methodology employed by the Company to calculate  
21 the true-up, and it recommends the Company's proposed adjustor fee of \$1.15 per 1,000 gallons.

1 **True-up**

2 7. The CAGR D invoice to Sahuarita for the 2012 annual replenishment assessment was  
3 \$439,872.32. Sahuarita reports that, as of September 30, 2014, the Company will have total collections  
4 and interest of \$380,860.17.<sup>3</sup>

5 8. This true-up calculation indicates an under-collection of approximately \$40,059.07 as  
6 follows:

13 **Adjuster Fee**

14 9. The 2013 CAGR D invoice to Sahuarita states total charges due of \$512,734.32. The  
15 Company proposes a per 1,000 gallon adjustor charge of \$1.15, based on water produced of  
16 480,484,000 or 1,474.5 acre feet. Staff's calculation of the new CAGR D adjustor fee is shown below.

1 Conclusions and Recommendations

2 10. Staff concludes that the Company has filed the appropriate request to revise the  
3 CAGRDR adjustor fees as required by Decision No. 73283.

4 11. Staff recommends approval of the CAGRDR adjustor fees as described herein.

5 12. Staff recommends that the Company file, within 7 days of a Decision in this matter, a  
6 CAGRDR adjustor fee tariff consistent with the rates approved herein.

7 13. Staff recommends that the Company notify its customers of the CAGRDR adjustor fee  
8 tariff approved herein within 30 days from the effective date of the Decision in a form and manner  
9 acceptable to Staff.

10 14. Staff recommends that the CAGRDR adjustor fees authorized herein become effective  
11 for all water sold after December 1, 2014.

12 15. We find that Staff's conclusions and recommendations are reasonable and should be  
13 adopted.

14 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

15 1. Sahuarita Water Company, L.L.C. is a public water service corporation within the  
16 meaning of Article XV of the Arizona Constitution and A.R.S. §§ 40-250 and 40-252.

17 2. The Commission has jurisdiction over Sahuarita Water Company, L.L.C. and the  
18 subject matter of the application.

19 3. Approval of the proposed CAGRDR adjustor fees is consistent with the Commission's  
20 authority under the Arizona Constitution, Arizona ratemaking statutes and applicable case law.

21 4. It is in the public interest to approve the Sahuarita Water Company, L.L.C.'s request  
22 for implementation of the CAGRDR adjustor fees as discussed herein.

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ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the application by Sahuarita Water Company, LLC to implement a new CAGR D adjustor fee of \$1.15 per 1,000 gallons, is approved for all customer billings for water sold after December 1, 2014.

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1 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Sahuarita Water Company, LLC docket with the  
2 Commission as a compliance matter, within seven (7) days of the effective date of this Decision, a  
3 CAGRDR adjustor fee tariff consistent with the rates approved herein.

4 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Sahuarita Water Company, LLC shall notify its customers  
5 of the CAGRDR adjustor fee approved herein within 30 days of the effective date of this Decision in a  
6 form and manner acceptable to the Commission's Utilities Division Staff.

7 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Decision shall become effective immediately.

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
