PROCEDURAL ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On March 10, 2014, EPCOR Water Arizona, Inc. ("EPCOR" or "Company") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application for a determination of the fair value of its utility plant and property and for increases in its water and wastewater rates and charges for utility service by its Mohave Water District, Paradise Valley Water District, Sun City Water District, Tubac Water District, and Mohave Wastewater District.

On April 4, 2014, the Commission's Utilities Division ("Staff") issued a Letter of Sufficiency pursuant to Arizona Administrative Code ("A.A.C.") R14-2-103, and classified the Company as a Class A utility.

By Procedural Order issued October 16, 2014, the hearing in this matter was rescheduled to commence on March 9, 2015, and other procedural deadlines were established.

To date, intervention has been granted to the Residential Utility Consumer Office ("RUCO"), the Santa Cruz Valley Citizens Council, Marshall Magruder, the Town of Paradise Valley, the Water Utility Association of Arizona, Delman E. Eastes, Paradise Valley Country Club, and jointly to the Sanctuary Camelback Mountain Resort & Spa, JW Marriott Camelback Inn, Albert Gervenack, Omni Scottsdale Resort & Spa at Montelucia, and Sun City Homeowners Association ("SCHOA").

1 On January 20, 2015, EPCOR filed a Request for Extension of Time to File Testimony.
2 EPCOR and Staff requested that the deadline for filing Staff and intervenor testimony on issues other
3 than rate design be extended from January 20, 2015, to January 23, 2015.

4 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that **the deadline for filing Staff and intervenor testimony**
5 **on issues other than rate design shall be extended from January 20, 2015, to January 23, 2015.**

6 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all parties must comply with Rules 31 and 38 of the Rules
7 of the Arizona Supreme Court and A.R.S. § 40-243 with respect to the practice of law and admission
8 *pro hac vice*.

9 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that withdrawal of representation must be made in compliance
10 with A.A.C. R14-3-104(E) and Rule 1.16 of the Rules of Professional Conduct (under Rule 42 of the
11 Rules of the Arizona Supreme Court). Representation before the Commission includes appearances
12 at all hearings and procedural conferences, as well as all Open Meetings for which the matter is
13 scheduled for discussion, unless counsel has previously been granted permission to withdraw by the
14 Administrative Law Judge or the Commission.

15 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Ex Parte Rule (A.A.C. R14-3-113 - Unauthorized
16 Communications) continues to apply to this proceeding and shall remain in effect until the
17 Commission's Decision in this matter is final and non-appealable.

18 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the time periods specified herein shall not be extended
19 pursuant to Rule 6(a) or (e) of the Rules of Civil Procedure.

20 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Administrative Law Judge may rescind, alter, amend,
21 or waive any portion of this Procedural Order either by subsequent Procedural Order or by ruling at
22 hearing.
