PROCEDURAL ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On March 10, 2014, EPCOR Water Arizona, Inc. ("EPCOR" or "Company") filed with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application for a determination of the fair value of its utility plant and property and for increases in its water and wastewater rates and charges for utility service by its Mohave Water District, Paradise Valley Water District, Sun City Water District, Tubac Water District, and Mohave Wastewater District.

On April 4, 2014, the Commission's Utilities Division ("Staff") issued a Letter of Sufficiency pursuant to Arizona Administrative Code ("A.A.C.") R14-2-103, and classified the Company as a Class A utility.

By Procedural Order issued October 16, 2014, the hearing in this matter was rescheduled to commence on March 9, 2015, and other procedural deadlines were established.

To date, intervention has been granted to the Residential Utility Consumer Office ("RUCO"), the Santa Cruz Valley Citizens Council, Marshall Magruder, the Town of Paradise Valley, the Water Utility Association of Arizona, Delman E. Eastes, Paradise Valley Country Club, and jointly to the Sanctuary Camelback Mountain Resort & Spa, JW Marriott Camelback Inn, Albert Gervenack, Omni Scottsdale Resort & Spa at Montelucia, and Sun City Homeowners Association.

1 On February 19, 2015, RUCO filed a Request for Extension to File Surrebuttal Testimony.
2 RUCO states that its witnesses have been involved in another hearing at the Commission and that
3 RUCO needs a three-day extension, from February 23, 2015 to February 26, 2015, to finalize its
4 surrebuttal testimony. RUCO indicates that Staff supports the extension request but EPCOR has
5 agreed to only a two-day extension.

6 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that **RUCO's extension request is hereby granted and the**
7 **surrebuttal testimony for Staff and all Intervenors shall therefor be filed by no later than**
8 **February 26, 2015.**

9 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that **the filing deadline for EPCOR's rejoinder testimony**
10 **shall be extended accordingly. Rejoinder testimony shall be filed by no later than March 5,**
11 **2015.**

12 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all parties must comply with Rules 31 and 38 of the Rules
13 of the Arizona Supreme Court and A.R.S. § 40-243 with respect to the practice of law and admission
14 *pro hac vice*.

15 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that withdrawal of representation must be made in compliance
16 with A.A.C. R14-3-104(E) and Rule 1.16 of the Rules of Professional Conduct (under Rule 42 of the
17 Rules of the Arizona Supreme Court). Representation before the Commission includes appearances
18 at all hearings and procedural conferences, as well as all Open Meetings for which the matter is
19 scheduled for discussion, unless counsel has previously been granted permission to withdraw by the
20 Administrative Law Judge or the Commission.

21 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Ex Parte Rule (A.A.C. R14-3-113 - Unauthorized
22 Communications) continues to apply to this proceeding and shall remain in effect until the
23 Commission's Decision in this matter is final and non-appealable.

24 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the time periods specified herein shall not be extended
25 pursuant to Rule 6(a) or (e) of the Rules of Civil Procedure.


