STIPULATION BETWEEN

ALECA AND AMERICAN BROADBAND AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMPANY

American Broadband and Telecommunications Company ("American Broadband") and the Arizona Local Exchange Carriers Association ("ALECA") submit the following stipulation concerning American Broadband's Application in this docket:

1. American Broadband is seeking ETC designation, but is not seeking designation on the lands of Federally Recognized Tribes in Arizona.
2. To address potential ALECA concerns with this requested designation, American Broadband agrees that it will not provide Lifeline service to eligible residents residing on the lands of Federally Recognized Tribes in Arizona unless or until American Broadband has obtained any and all necessary licenses or other forms of approval that may be required by a Tribe. Before providing such service on tribal lands, American Broadband would file a copy of the tribal license or other form of approval with the Arizona Corporation Commission in Docket No. T-20924A-15-0068, with a copy to ALECA's undersigned counsel.

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3. To ensure that American Broadband does not inadvertently provide service to residents of the lands of a Federally Recognized Tribe for which American Broadband has not obtained all necessary licenses or other forms of approval, American Broadband further agrees that its Lifeline enrollment application for Arizona will:

- (a) Require an applicant to provide a street address; and
- (b) Include a provision that requires an applicant under penalty of perjury (i) to self-certify that he or she does not reside on the lands of a Federally Recognized Tribe in Arizona, or (ii) to identify the Federally Recognized Tribe on the lands of which he or she resides.

If the applicant does reside on the lands of a Federally Recognized Tribe for which American Broadband has not received the approvals identified in Paragraph 2, American Broadband will not provide service to the applicant.

4. Given this stipulation, ALECA does not oppose American Broadband's Application in this docket and does not believe that a hearing is necessary to address ALECA's concerns.
