

You will find a wealth of factual information about the Florence Copper Project and why Johnson Utilities as well as a large group of local business representatives, community leaders and adjacent property owners and residents believe the proposed Florence Copper Mine Project is detrimental to our community and the Town of Florence.

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Florence, local residents and landowners have been successful in rejecting efforts of Florence Copper Inc. from using the Town of Florence as the testing grounds for a new mining technique that would inject billions of gallons of sulfuric acid into the ground in an effort to mine copper. The risky mining proposal, that has never been successfully operated anywhere in the United States, has been soundly rejected by the Town through two failed General Plan and Zoning Amendment attempts. As you may know, an administrative law judge and the Arizona Water Quality Appeals Board validated the significant concerns of those opposing the mine by rejecting a permit granted to foreign-owned Florence Copper, Inc. by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality.

The Judge and the Board effectively determined the Temporary Permit issued to Florence Copper Inc. was unlawfully, arbitrarily, and unreasonably issued. Florence Copper Inc. will now have to submit to ADEQ previously withheld information and substantially revised application materials to address the numerous critical problems identified and outlined in a 155 page document prepared by the judge. In fact, the withheld materials were only obtained through legal action by Southwest Value Partners, since Florence Copper Inc. repeatedly refused to cooperate and disclose the information. The public will now have another opportunity to comment and appeal any newly issued permit to ensure legal compliance and public safety.

On a separate track Florence Copper Inc. is also seeking a permit from the United States Environmental Protection Agency for a pilot test on a portion of State Land. This activity is smaller in scope than the state's temporary permit discussed above but also focuses on the injection into the well field and impacts to groundwater. In fact many of the same issues and concerns above apply to this permit request as well. They include:

- The permit would allow contaminants to be discharged into the regional drinking water.
- The permit relies improperly on Florence Copper Inc. assumptions, models and calculations.
- The EPA doesn't consider surrounding uses and significant developments to have occurred in the area over the last 17 years since the original permit was issued.

Many residents and Town officials wrote letters of opposition and testified to the risks involved with this plan at the US Environmental Protection Agency's public hearing held last month.



NOTICE OF CHANGE IN RATES AND CHARGES

The Arizona Corporation Commission approved a change to Johnson Utilities, LLC's Central Arizona Groundwater Replenishment District ("CAGRDR") adjuster fee for its water service. This fee is collected and paid directly to the CAGRDR to replenish groundwater pulled from the aquifer. The new rates listed below have gone into effect for Phoenix AMA on December 1 2014 & Pinal AMA service rendered on and after February 1, 2015.
