Dear Commissioners,

Thank you in advance for your valuable time. As you know, SRP plans to install 160 foot 220kV power lines above ground along the Union Pacific Railroad tracks from the Schrader Substation, South to the GRIC Tribal Boundary, to service the growing Price Road Corridor. My family supports the overall purpose of the Price Road Corridor project, and welcomes more businesses to strengthen Chandler, and Arizona over all. However, installing these lines above ground would negatively affect 1,000's of home owners aesthetically, financially, and potentially their health.

**- Aesthetically:**

My family takes pride in the visual and aesthetic appearance of our community. This is important to us! Installing these lines electrical eyesores is at a minimum, a 100 year decision irreparably damaging the look and feel of South Chandler. I understand there are already other 220kV lines throughout Chandler, but they have been there for years. They were there before homes were built, and those families that chose to purchase their homes in close proximity did so knowingly. The communities that will be affected if the new lines are erected above ground did not have that choice, and should not have it forced upon them.

**- Financially:**

Our property values will be decimated. Unlike the real-estate bubble, property values will not return. We have worked extremely hard to earn a living and purchase a piece of the American dream. Our home is our biggest asset, and SRP should not have the right to devalue what we have worked hard for. I have attended multiple SRP held community outreach meetings. At EVERY meeting, homeowners expressed their concerns over property values being reduced if the above ground lines were installed. SRP's response was nothing more than a shrug of the shoulders, and a statement of "Our data indicates power lines do not affect property values". I am not sure what data they have accumulated, but I can personally say that my family decided NOT to put offers on various homes throughout Chandler as they were in close

proximity to high voltage power lines. I have also spoken with multiple real-estate professionals that have said, while the Maricopa County Assessor does not take power lines into consideration when valuating homes, consumers DO, and many walk away from homes without even looking inside.

**- Potential Health Risks:**

There are hundreds of articles reporting on the dangerous effects of living near high-voltage power lines to children (**leukemia, brain tumors**). There are an equal number of articles that state it is not a problem. We have 3 small children all under the age of 9. They love their home as do we, but how can we justify staying in a home that may or may not cause irreversible health risks? Would you want your children or grandchildren living next to and playing around these power lines even if there was the **slightest** chance of putting them in harm's way? We should not be forced to decide between a home that we love and our children's health when that decision is forced upon us.

*For years, the tobacco industry through its propaganda and lobbyists had the public believing that nicotine was safe. Now, we come to find out that this is anything but true. Given our past experience, shouldn't we err on the side of caution?*

I have lived in Arizona for all of my life, and have been proud to call South Chandler home for the last 6 years. My family and I moved to this area for the schools, the community, and to enjoy a higher quality of life. **Please only vote to Approve With Modifications**, with those modifications being that SRP buries the power lines along the railroad tracks from the Schrader Substation to the GRIC land. SRP states the cost of burying lines is 10x the cost of above ground power. Unfortunately, those costs have yet to be substantiated, and in fact come from outdated reports taken from installing lines in highly developed residential/commercial areas. We are only talking about burying 2.6 miles of power lines next to a railroad track.

Thank you again for your time. I hope you strongly consider **APPROVING ONLY WITH MODIFICATIONS**.

Dear Commissioners,

I am a 20 year Chandler resident writing to you because I'm deeply concerned with what's about to happen to my neighborhood. SRP wants to erect new 150 foot 230kV overhead transmission lines in Chandler. As you are aware, the proposed route will be constructed along the Union Pacific railroad tracks near Arizona Avenue, south past Hunt Highway.

SRP has been trying for several years to get these high-voltage lines erected in south Chandler to satisfy energy needs to the Price Road Corridor. Neighborhood after neighborhood has fought SRP and pleaded with the City of Chandler to not approve these lines near their neighborhoods, schools, churches, etc. Obviously, no one wants these lines anywhere near them. However, the City of Chandler has somehow approved the lines to be erected in a stretch of Chandler that negatively affects thousands of residents. Shame on the City of Chandler for approving this, it is an outrage!

I attended an SRP "Open House" a few months ago at Hamilton High School. This was the first time I was aware of the power lines potentially being constructed in our area. After that I attended the Public Meetings at the San Marcos Hotel held by the City of Chandler. I have serious concerns with how, both SRP and the City of Chandler conducted these meetings. The integrity of what was said and the obvious disdain the chairman had for the residents who voiced their concerns during the "Public Comments" portion of these meetings was very troublesome.

First of all, the SRP representative I met at Hamilton High told me the lines were *definitely* going in either on the rail road tracks or AZ Ave and there was only one decision to be made "which route did I prefer?" He urged me to fill out a comment card that stated I preferred the AZ Ave route, which I did, as that would be further from my neighborhood. After educating myself in the following weeks I discovered he was manipulating me and others who came to the open house.

At the "Public Comments" portion of the meetings held by the city there were hundreds of residents in attendance. After the first person spoke the crowd erupted in applause. The chairman immediately and in a disgusted tone shouted "I can shut this meeting down!" He told us if the applause continued it would be the end for us. Apparently he, and probably the rest of the sub-committee, had their minds up and I knew at that time we were in big trouble.

Additionally, there were at least three residents that I recall who voiced health and safety concerns of these power lines. I tell you all this because the city blatantly dismissed our health concerns and outright ignored them. I have proof of this because the next day as the meetings continued, a question was asked if anyone at the "Public Comments" portion had any safety or health concerns. Everyone on that panel shook their heads and said "no." Many of us in the audience were dumbfounded, looking at one another in disbelief. This was in fact a concern of many who spoke only one night earlier.

For many reasons, high-voltage power lines are not appropriate for construction near residential neighborhoods. This route passes *through* dozens of neighborhoods, in some cases just *yards* away from homes,

parks, churches and businesses. It even crosses through a flight path of Chandler Municipal Airport, one of the country's busiest general aviation airports. This makes no sense!

There is no question property values will be *greatly* affected along this path if these 150 foot power lines are erected. I sold real estate in the valley for ten years and I can tell you with great certainty this is a fact. Common sense tells you this, you don't need a professional opinion to determine this. However, SRP claimed in one of their community meetings that home values are not negatively affected when high-powered lines are installed near homes. This is an outrage! Once again, SRP is being dishonest and manipulative.

What's more, SRP says they cannot afford to bury these lines. I'm telling you Chandler residents can't afford for them *not* to be buried. Some of us can expect to lose well over \$100,000 in home values! In my neighborhood alone it's expected we will lose more than \$10 million combined. For the vast majority of us, our homes are our greatest financial investment. SRP can absorb the costs of burying the lines, they can even raise rates. If there one million customers paid a one-time \$30 fee that would pay to bury the lines. What can the home owners do? We will NEVER recoup our losses yet we are supposed to sit back and let SRP install these lines because it's "too expensive" to bury them? We plead with you to reject the SRP proposal to erect above ground lines – they need to be *buried* as they cross through residential areas. Again, this is common sense!

As previously mentioned, there is a grave concern among residents that these lines will create health and safety risks to our children. The risk of contracting childhood leukemia increases when children are exposed to high voltage power lines. SRP even admitted to this in their public hearings several years ago. This proposed route runs adjacent to greenbelts and parks where our children play, fly kites, etc. This is not safe! Would you raise your family 30 yards away from high-voltage lines? Is it fair to construct these lines near established neighborhoods and risk even one child's life?

We all want to see the Price Road Corridor become more attractive to local businesses, thereby stimulating the economy with job creation and increased tax revenue. In light of the power going to our "technology hub" isn't it appropriate for us to get power to this area in a modern way? This can be achieved by burying the lines so that the aesthetics of our beautiful community is not negatively impacted.

It's not fair to force high powered lines upon thousands of residents. In doing this you are placing all the risk onto us. We have nothing to gain by this individually, yet we are bearing all the cost. Is this fair? Or is it fair to ask those who will benefit to bear the cost to bury the lines?

Aside from property value loss and potential health risks to our families we will be forced to look at disguising power lines 150 tall. My family immensely enjoys our lake view where we watch the sunset every night- that's why we chose this home and paid a lot premium, to see the beautiful sunsets every night. As they say in real estate, it's all about "location, location, location." Soon our location will be a detriment, not an asset. Our beautiful view will be forever marred as we will soon be looking out upon massive 150 foot power polls, power lines and giant orange and yellow balls dangling from them. I ask you again, is this fair to my family?

Additionally there are potential aviation risks due to the proximity of a very well established and extremely busy airport, Chandler Municipal Airport. If an airplane or hot air balloon were to hit one of these lines it would be tragic, not to mention the potential power outage for a very large area of Chandler.

Underground transmission lines are becoming the norm in populated areas, not only in the US but across the world. One of the many benefits has to do with potential terrorist plots. There can be no tampering with lines that are buried.

Chandler prides itself on the technology hub of Price Road Corridor. It's very innovative and progressive, so why are we using dated technology to supply them power? The only answer is to bury the lines. Going down the railroad tracks is a fine idea, erecting them so that people will see them for miles and miles is a horrendous idea.

Please put yourselves in our shoes and ask yourself "Would I want these high-voltage lines in my backyard?" or "Is this what's best for the good people of Arizona who have elected me to represent them?"

Chandler is one of the most beautiful and desirable cities in all of Arizona. With your help we can keep it that way. I urge you to reject the current proposed SRP power line route. The lines need to be buried!

Did any of you attend the council meeting last Thursdays? There were hundreds upon hundreds of South Chandler residents their to voice our extreme concerns:

My name is Soraya Ali. I reside at 401 E. Crescent Place with my husband, Terry André Hope. Our home is to the extreme west of Pinelake Estates and we are separated by the railway tracks by the green belt.

I presented the SRP with 35 studies conducted by reputable agencies such as Johns Hopkins University and The National Institute of Environmental Sciences, that correlated exposure the ELF-EMFs produced by high voltage power lines directly with cancers; Especially pediatric cancers such childhood leukemia, numerous types of brain cancers, breast cancer, and on and on. I am a pharmaceutical chemist and worked in the development of chemotherapy drugs to treat these deadly diseases.

My name is Robert Bybee Jr. and spouse, Vickie, at 4550 S. Fresno St. in Chandler and I urge the Arizona Corporate Commission approve the current SRP line of site proposal ... WITH MODIFICATION ... that the power lines MUST be buried from the Schroeder sub-station along the RR tracks to the Gila River Reservation - the full 2.7 miles.

Our concerns with the over-head towers are:

- Decline in property values
- Decline in city appeal for the city of Chandler and the surrounding communities with unsightly 160 foot towers blocking and polluting the skyline.
- Health and safety concerns for all residents – what happens if a train derailes and crashes into a tower and that tower falls on homes nearby? What about the flight patterns going into Chandler airport? What about 230 KHz buzzing over-head non-stop? Would you want your children or grandchildren playing around these high power lines day and night? What happens when the power they carry is increased when they run power BACK from the solar farm that will be built on Gila River land into the SRP grid via the Schroeder sub-station?

You MUST do what is best for our city and its residents and ensure that the lines be buried that run through residential areas. The cost associated with this project has been vastly exaggerated by SRP as other instances have shown the true cost is more likely 3-4x of over-head power lines – about \$10MM in total – not per mile. There is no demolition that needs to be done as that area is already open and clear.

Please ACC approve the project WITH MODIFICATION ... the power lines that will be installed the 2.7 miles along the RR tracks from the Schroeder substation to the Gila River Reservation MUST be buried.

We moved into our home in Pinelake Estates in January, 2015. We purchased our home in this community because we love the pine trees and lake. We are originally from MN and this just feels like home. We recently retired and get countless hours of enjoyment watching the birds that fly over and land in the lake. Just this morning about 20 cormorants landed in our bay and as they were leap frogging over each other in the water, a grey heron watched from our shoreline. It was so exciting! We would hope to keep the view of these wonderful birds without seeing the towering power lines that SRP is planning on building next to the railroad tracks that are close to our home. Our grandchildren are small, ages 4, 2 and 16 months. We look forward to teaching them how to fish on this lake and enjoy the western sunsets without having to look through 160 feet high power lines.

Health and Safety concerns are a real issue for us. My mother is elderly and has a deep brain stimulator (dbs) implanted to help control the painful tremors she has from her Parkinson's disease. Will these power lines affect this stimulator? I have a friend whose father had a dbs system and he was told by his neurologist to stay away from power lines. Does this mean she will not be able to visit us? How close do you have to be before it affects her programming? I am currently awaiting a call from my mom's neurologist to get her opinion.

WE urge you and the rest of the city council to IMMEDIATELY send a letter to the AZ Corporate Commission that they approve the current SRP line of site proposal ... WITH MODIFICATION ... that the power lines MUST be buried from the Schroeder sub-station along the RR tracks to the Gila River Reservation - the full 2.7 miles. Why should our neighborhood and surrounding neighborhoods suffer from dropping property values, ugly skylines and health and safety issues, when so many members of the Chandler community, Gila River Indian Community and Business Community along the Price Road Corridor will benefit from the increased electrical capabilities this solar farm will produce? SRP stands to make a lot of money with this project in the upcoming years – should they be able to do this at the expense of neighborhoods?
