I am writing to urge you to reject Trico's proposed fee for customers who install solar rooftop systems.

As a member of Trico, I strongly urge the Arizona Corporation Commission to reject its proposal to make extreme cuts to the rate it pays solar customers for generating electricity to the grid, effectively penalizing those who install solar rooftop systems.

Cutting the rate from 12 cents per kilowatt-hour to less than four cents per kilowatt-hour will make solar much less affordable for the average customer and fails to recognize the significant benefits solar provides.

Trico argues that ratepayers who install solar are not paying their share of fixed costs. This ignores all of the benefits that solar customers provide to the grid and to our communities, including less water use and pollution.

Utility customers who install rooftop solar don't just save grid electricity. Solar customers add reliability to the grid by reducing vulnerability to unplanned outages at power plants. Plus, they add energy during the day, when demand is high and when it is more expensive for utilities to generate or buy electricity. But, unlike the utilities, they do not pass on either fixed or operating costs.
