Good Evening Commissioners,  
I would like to bring to your attention a snippet of an email I sent to Chris Johnson today (with Brad Coles response)

1) When my driver tried to open a STWC account at the main yard today he was told he needed something called a "water haulers permit". Can you send me a copy of the roadrunner permit so we know exactly what you are looking for? I am unaware of such a thing in Pinal county.

Thank you for taking the time to spend the day down at the ACC open meeting yesterday. The Commissioners requested a follow-up meeting on August 27 to continue this discussion and to allow for additional time for dialogue and discoveries. Until after that date, we are in a state of limbo regarding the commercial use of our temporary standpipe located at the Johnson Utilities' main yard. The details or logistics of the future use of that temporary standpipe by commercial water haulers have not yet been worked out.

Note that there are multiple issues here, First hey have verbally requested a "permit" that does not exist. Second, when I asked about that in writing, they flat out said they haven't worked out all of the details

until the 27th. Not only did that dodge the answer I blatantly asked, but they totally went a different direction that implied not even Roadrunner should be delivering. Also note that Roadrunner Transit is still delivering. Am I not mistaken in that the order was given yesterday without any clauses or stipulations and that they are trying to pass roadrunner off as a third party contractor company? If they have rules for Roadrunner were they not ordered to extend those same rules to other haulers? San Tan Water Company is an ACC registered business. Does this imply J.U. is in direct violation of that order?

Is there any way we can get an emergency meeting together on Friday to get this rectified? Please note that since RT is getting 24/7/365 access to the temporary standpipe, the order means STWC should get the same access.

I have to applaud Commissioners Forese's statements about removing politics in this entire situation, can we apply those sentiments here and get some resolution to all of this political side-stepping that continues to happen? We (STWC and the neighborhood as a whole) have won 5 separate rulings/orders/etc over the last 2 months and EVERY SINGLE TIME, the situation has immediately gotten worse for us. Is there nothing we can do to stop this nonsense from the company?

Please note that after the threats from George/Chris/Bret of shutting down the whole project, most of our community who were planning to speak out did not show up out of fear they would be the reason they didn't get piping, and many that did show up (including me) rewrote their speeches so as not to "attack" so much...again out of the threats posed by the Johnson crew. I now feel cheated and while I knew better from the outset to buy into those "threats" I thought perhaps "their word was their bond" as they so like to flaunt.

On a more pleasant note. I want to thank all of your for your overwhelming support at the public meeting on the 18th. I did not hear one person disappointed in all of your enthusiasm towards our cause and it was taken as a great sign that we do have a voice on this important matter.

Thank you for your timely attention to this matter.

- 3) On Friday (possibly Monday) I have to start making some decisions how I proceed with this whole thing. Having not heard anything from you guys I am a little confused about what I should do. You have one offer that I placed already. Alternatively, to keep this more low key if you would like, I can offer that you simply purchase my portion of the assets of my company. Essentially just a private party sale. That should pretty much allow me to move on with my life and get this chapter behind me.

Only you can decide what is best for you. At this time, we are not able to provide any advice toward this decision. We wish you well.
