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



Company received authorization July 30<sup>th</sup> 2012 to obtain a 20 year amortizing loan through the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (2) Emergency Generators and a new 50,000 gallon storage tank. Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona received and reviewed Appaloosa's application for financial assistance and on September 24, 2012 informed the Company that the storage tank component of the project was ineligible for WIFA financing. The emergency generators for \$60,000 would be considered after Appaloosa updated the project priority list application with only the generators. Company's re-evaluation of the project after learning that WIFA after its' review considered the company had enough storage for the system peak day demand and the \$60,000 not being enough for the placement of (2) generators for the 2 wells it was concluded that the storage tank be removed for consideration and that 1 well (high yield well) would be where the 1 emergency generator needed to be placed.

Company proceeded to file a new financial application with the Arizona Corporation Commission to obtain authorization to change from 2 emergency generators to one to apply to WIFA making this a new application. The authorization for financing in Decision No. 73270 had terminated and was not needed to be rescinded.

Company did not receive any executed documents from WIFA.
