NOTIFICATION OF  
INTERVENTION

BY THE COMMISSION:

On May 5, 2015, UNS Electric, Inc. ("UNSE" or "Company") filed an Application with the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission") for a rate increase. By Procedural Order dated June 22, 2015, the matter was set for hearing to commence on March 1, 2016, and other procedural guidelines were established.

On October 14, 2015, the Fresh Produce Association of Americas ("FPAA") filed an Application for Leave to Intervene. On October 15, 2015, FPAA filed a Notice of Service for its Application. FPAA states that it is a member trade organization, whose members are involved in the production, harvest, marketing, importation and distribution of fresh Mexican produce into the United States and the world. FPAA members are located in UNSE's service area in Santa Cruz County and receive electric power from UNSE.


On October 15, 2015, Trico Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("Trico") filed an Application to Intervene. Trico provides electric service to approximately 38,000 members in Pima, Pinal and Santa Cruz Counties, and asserts that UNSE's proposed modifications to its net metering tariff and rate design may affect other utilities in Arizona, including Trico, who are facing similar issues regarding distributed generation.

There was no opposition to the intervention requests of FPAA or Trico.

1 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that **intervention is granted to FPAA and Trico.**

2 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Administrative Law Judge may rescind, alter, amend or  
3 waive any portion of this Procedural Order either by subsequent Procedural Order or by ruling at a  
4 hearing.
